## March is Windless Month; Rain Fall Above Average

The third rain within a week and the sixth within the present month, fell over Runnels county Wednesday night filling the local rain gauge to almost an inch, and bringing the total rainfall at Ballinger to three and one-tenth inches. In some sections of the county the total precipitation for the month amounts to as much as six inches.

This makes March 1926 the wettest March in a thirty-year period, and perhaps the calmest March, as there has been practically no wind this month.

Rain earlier in the present week amounted to only half an inch at Ballinger, but as much as four inches fell in some localities. Farmers reported that fences were washed down, and land which had been plowed was packed in some fields.

The Wednesday night's rain was general over the county, but not as heavy as last Sunday's rain. No damage was reported. Following is the way the gauge stands at Ballinger:

## VOTES TO UNSEAT G. O. P. SENATOR

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 25.—A majority of the Senate elections committee voted today in recommending the unseating of Senator Smith W. Brookhart, republican, in favor of Daniel Steck, democrat, who challenged Brookhart's election.

Recount of the votes in the Steck-Brookhart race showed Steck had received a majority of the votes cast in the last general election.

## MAKES SURVEY OF FARM LIFE

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 25.—The living standard of the farmer, like almost everybody else, varies with his income, according to a survey and study made by the Department of Agriculture. The survey covered 816 families living on farms in Texas, Tennessee and Kentucky.

Prosperous families owning their own homes were found to have spent \$130 per year for social advancement and elevated their standard of living. Tenant families spent \$51 for social advancement, and what are known as "cropper" families spent \$21.

## AUTO FOR EVERY 5 PERSONS IN U.S.

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 25.—More than twenty million automobiles were in use in the United States last year, the bureau of public roads reported today.

According to the figures there was a car in use for every five and eight-tenths persons, an increase in the number of cars of 13.40 per cent over the year 1924.

Texas reported an increase of over twenty per cent in the number of autos registered.

## AFTER LONG SEARCH FOR A HOME MOVES TO VALLEY

(By Associated Press) EDINBURG, Tex., March 25.—A pilgrimage from England to find a home in Texas has ended in the Rio Grande valley for Dr. and Mrs. Thomas S. Shepherd. Dr. Shepherd is a surgeon of Ross, England. He has just settled in Edinburg with a view to purchasing a 40 acre citrus farm, and expects to be joined later by several other families from England.

Dr. Shepherd said he had visited several countries and several other states of the United States and finally selected the Rio Grande valley as his future home. He and Mrs. Shepherd left England six weeks ago. They landed in Boston and then traveled leisurely down through the Atlantic states, stopping in New York, Washington, New Orleans, Houston and Corpus Christi.

## STORM WRECKS SCHOOL HOUSING 300 CHILDREN

(By Associated Press) ORANGE, Tex., March 25.—One man is dead and eight persons are in hospitals as the result of a tornado which struck Orange Field, an oil field, seven miles west of here, this morning. About one hundred derricks in the oil field and several buildings were blown down. Klenn Keowan was killed by a falling derrick.

The Orange Field school house, occupied by about three hundred children, was partly wrecked, but all the children escaped without injury.

DALLAS, March 25.—Rains were general over the state last night, according to reports received here today. In some sections there was considerable wind. Lightning and high winds in the San Antonio country damaged trees and crops, the report said. Hail fell in some sections of West Texas.

Freezes are promised tonight in the northern portion of the state while storm warnings have been issued for the Gulf Coast region.

## PROROSE A NEW TEXAS RAILROAD

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, March 25.—Application of the Panhandle & Santa Fe Railroad for authority to construct a line in Carson and Hutchinson counties, Texas, has been assigned for hearing.

The hearing will be held at Amarillo by the Interstate Commerce Commission on April 5th.

## KILLS DANCER THE SUICIDES

(By Associated Press) BERLIN, Germany, March 25.—John Goodrich, a medical student from Monroe, New Hampshire, today shot and killed Miss Alice Fitzner, of Cleveland, Ohio, and then took his own life.

Miss Fitzner was a dancer at a Berlin theatre, and the tragedy occurred while the couple were out riding in an automobile. Jealousy has been attributed as the cause for the murder and suicide.

## Field Seed CAN'T 'SHAKE' NEGRO WIFE

(By Associated Press) Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Mar. 25.—Justice Morschauer, of the supreme court, today denied Leonard Kip Rhinelander a new trial in his annulment action against his mulatto wife, Alice Jones Rhinelander.

The annulment case in which Rhinelander attempted to have the marriage set aside, was tried before Justice Morschauer last November, and the court refused to grant the annulment. It is understood that Rhinelander will appeal the case to the appellate division in Brooklyn.

## COURT REVERSES LOCAL CHIROPRACTIC CASE

(By Associated Press) The Court of Criminal Appeals passed on the C. L. Andrus chiropractic case Wednesday and reversed the decision of the Ballinger court, remanding the case for new trial.

Andrus, chiropractor of Miles, was tried here in the county court, convicted and given a \$100 fine and one minute in jail by the jury. The case was carried to the higher court by Parish & Crager, attorneys for Andrus.

The Andrus case was one of five filed in this county against chiropractors, and the only one of four which has been tried in which there was a conviction.

## YEGG TAKE \$100 IN SMALL CHANGE

(By Associated Press) WELLINGTON, Kans., March 25.—Two safe-blowers last night blasted their way to the vault of the State Bank of Mayfield, near here, and escaped with \$100 in nickles and pennies.

The yeggs escaped following a gun battle with townsmen in which it is believed that one of the yeggs was wounded.

### FARMER DROPS DEAD NEAR CITY

J. T. Brown, age about seventy years, died suddenly at his home on the Thomas Eagan farm, two miles North of Ballinger, about 8:00 o'clock Thursday morning. Mr. Brown had not been in good health for some time, but presumably was feeling as well as usual Thursday morning, as he had not complained. He got up at the usual hour, ate his breakfast, and was about as usual when he dropped dead in the room. The children had gone to school, or to work, when their father passed away.

Mr. Brown had been living in the New Home community and North of Ballinger for several years. He moved to the Eagan place in January and was preparing to make a crop. He is survived by a wife and ten children. The funeral arrangements were being delayed pending the arrival of children living at distant points in the state.

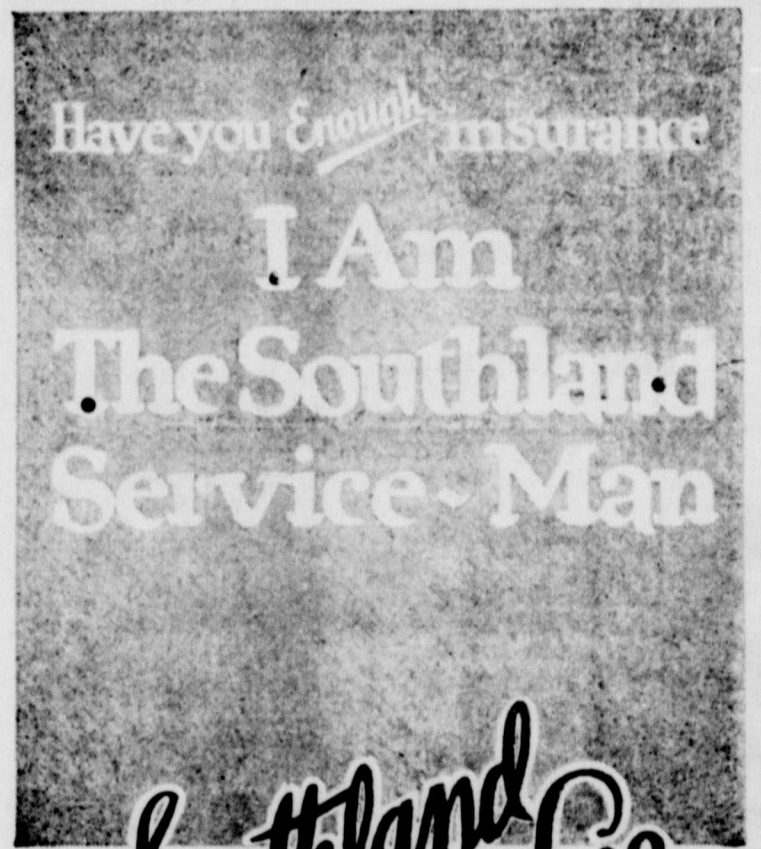

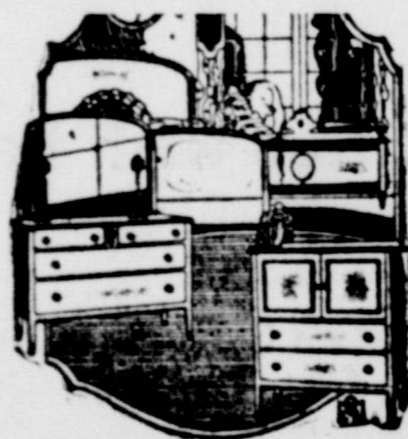
