

CLUB MEMBERS

Members of the Ballinger Country Club are getting their fishing tackle in readiness and the first fish taken from the club lake since the dam was built and the lake stocked with fish are expected to be pulled out next Saturday.

Of course the fishing in the lake will be confined to the members, and members must comply with rules governing fishing. The rules were drafted to correspond with the fish laws of the state.

In order to permit the lake to become well stocked with fish, when the body of water was created three years ago, no fishing has been permitted up to this time. One of the rules prohibited fishing in the lake until May 1st of this year, and this privilege will go to all members beginning next Saturday.

In order that all members of the elub might inform themselves, and not violate any of the fishing rules, the board of directors, thru the secretary, M. C. Atkins, have just furnished each member with a copy of the rules governing fishing which are as follows:

Rule No. 8 .- No person shall be permitted to take any fish from the lake until May 1st, 1926.

On next Saturday the above rule will become inoperative and fishing will be allowed in season. Rule No. 9-No person shall be permitted to take from the lake by any method bass or cat under Il inches, croppies under 7
