



#### Wrote Creditable History Of Travel Then Vanished (By Associated Press)

INDIANAPOLIS, May 14.-Af ter devoting five years to preparing a "History of Travel in America," regarded as an authoritative work on transportation, Seymour Dunbar, an itinerant newspaper worker, disappeared. A tenyear search by the Bobbs Merrill publishing company has failed to locate him.

The company expects to re-publish the history and desires that it be brought up to date.
