

The general contract calls for an expenditure of \$88,500. The heating and plumbing contract was awarded to C. E. Wallas, of Stamford, calling for an expenditure of \$10,500. The Moody Electric Company of Abilene, was awarded the contract for the installation of the electrical equipment for the sum of \$2,620.

The Winters school will be one of the most modern in this part of the state. David S. Castle, of Abilene, is the architect.

The building will be 130 by 58 feet. A wing is to extend back of the main section, 65x49 feet. which will house the main auditorium with a balcony.


