Vienna, Once Famed, is Now a Model City (By Associated Press) VIENNA, Oct. 5.—Within less than a year Vienna has become

one of the model cities of Europe. The Socialist-Democratic municipal government has erected 30,000 modern apartments for workers, a series of great public bath-houses, hospitals, children's homes, nurseries, schools, playgrounds, gymnasiums, municipal lodging-houses, trade schools, libraries, dental clinics, and social centers. More than 250 miles of streets and highways have been paved.

The whole city has been electrified, the underground railway rebuilt, omnibus and new trolley lines established, and a great electric power station installed.

TAHOKA, Tex. — Excavation work was begun recently on the erection of a new \$100,000 high school building for Tahoka. The present city investment in public school buildings is about \$65,000.

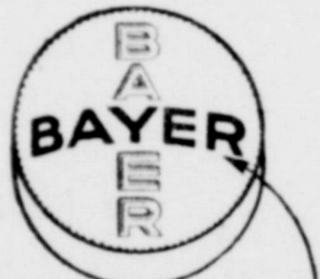
