

USE ELECTRIC BATTERY TO DETECT DIPHTHERIA

(By International News Service)

CHICAGO, Feb. 21.—Reaction of bacteria to an electric charge has been used by Professor I. S. Falk of the department of bacteriology at the University of Chicago in inventing a new method of detecting cases of diphtheria and is now being used and tested by public health bureaus in St. Louis, Los Angeles and other cities, it was announced

A culture from the diphtheria suspect is suspended in a neutral solution and a light electrical charge is passed through.

The time required by the bacteria as viewed through a microscope, to move a prescribed distance toward the positive or negative poles enables the bacteriolegist to determine its virulence. The most dangerous organisms move the slowest, according to Dr. Falk.
