

NEW YORK, April 13.—After a flurry of unconfirmed reports in the forenoon, this afternoon still found the Junkers monoplane Bremen missing and over due. This plane is piloted by Captain Herman Koehl, German ace, in an attempt to fly from Ireland to New York.

According to calculations made by Capt. Koehl, before he and his two companions left Baldonnel airdrome at Dublin yesterday morning, the plane was due to arrive at Mitchell Field, New York before noon today.

Nearly 37 hours had elapsed at 1:20 o'clock this afternoon.

In the meanwhile the Canadian government announced that no confirmation had been reseived of the report that Capt. Barkhouse, of the Canadian fisheries department, had sighted the monoplane over the southern coast of Nova Scotia.
