**DECLINE IN UNIVERSITY  
OIL ROYALTIES IS LESS**

(By International News Service)  
AUSTIN, May 19.—The \$30,000  
a month decline of the University  
of Texas permanent fund's re-  
ceipts from oil royalties in West  
Texas has slowed down, State  
Treasurer W. Gregory Hatcher  
stated.

The decline in April over March  
was less than \$10,000 in compar-  
ison with \$34,840 in February as  
compared with January, and  
\$29,480 in March compared with  
February.

The monthly receipts to this  
fund from oil royalties for the  
first four months of the year  
were:

January, \$254,947; February,  
\$220,107; March, \$190,887; April,  
\$183,481.

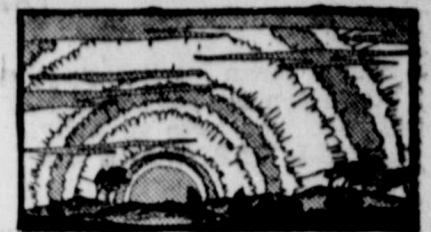

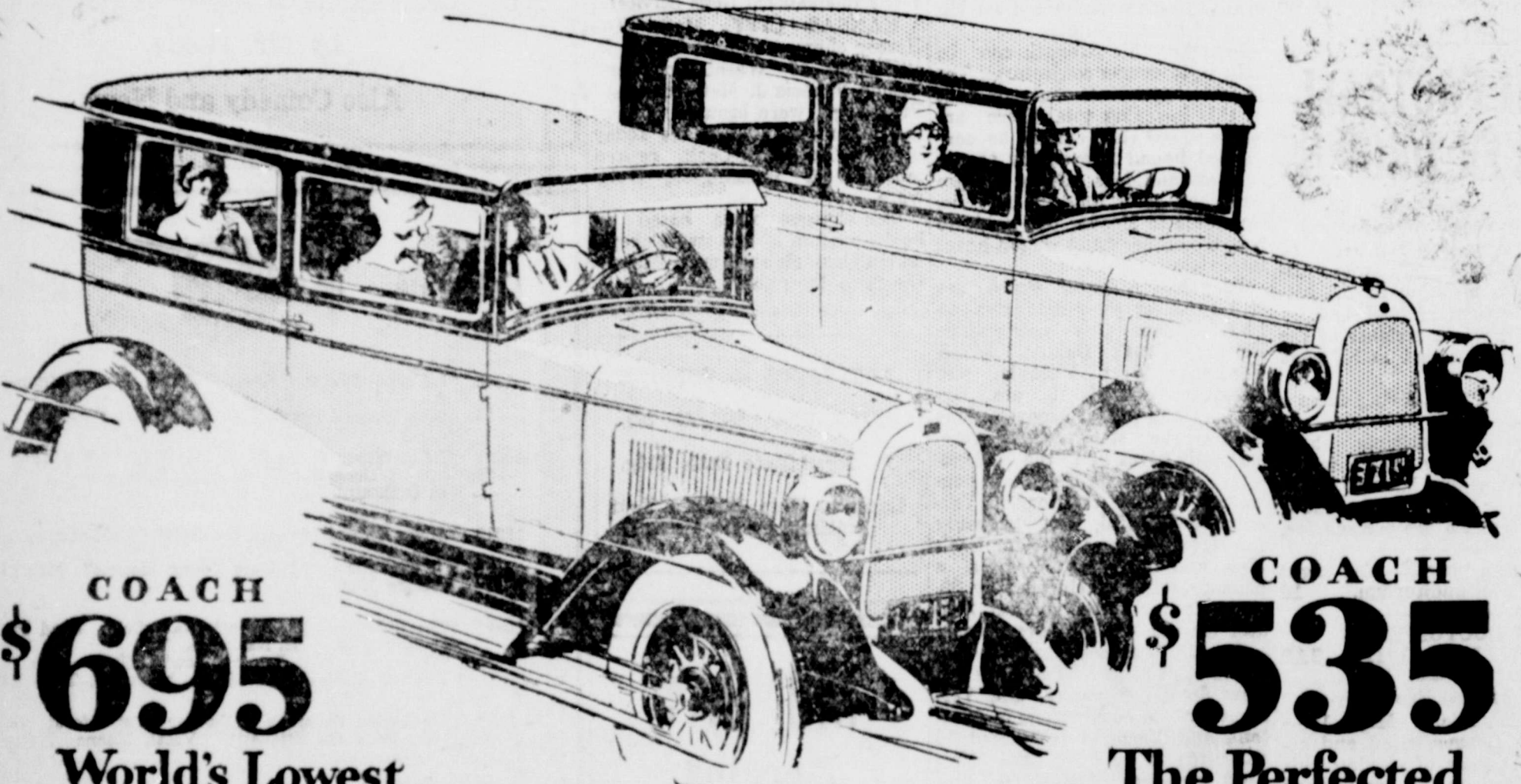

**Zane Grey Western "Open Range," set in New Mold**  
Characterizations in most western pictures seem to be cast in a common mold. There's always a handsome, up-standing hero; a pretty, old-fashioned girl and a dastardly villain.  
"Open Range" which opened a two-day run yesterday at the Palace Theatre seems to be the exception. Here is a story from the pen of Zane Grey that is unique in that its central characters act like human beings. And moreover, it is probably the most thrilling picture ever made from a Zane Grey novel.  
The picture is interesting, too, because of the cast. It is the first picture showing Lane Chandler, whom Paramount is hailing as its newest screen discovery. He merits their enthusiasm. Chandler is a big, good-looking lad who looks like a cowboy and not like an actor in chaps. Then there is Betty Bron-

son in ermines. She is the girl who became famous overnight as the screen "Peter Pan." This is her first western and she easily proves in it that Barrie's whimsical story is not the only type of role for which she is fitted. In "Open Range" Betty performs convincingly as a pretty girl of the frontier. Fred Kohler, known as "the wolf of the screen," is the villain. He is such a "bad un" in "Open Range" that the fans will have to suppress a feeling of friendliness for a man who could be so altogether sinful.  
The big punch in the picture comes in the last reel. Indians attack the town of Marco, where lives the heroine, and they are driven out only when the hero stampedes a herd of cattle into the town.

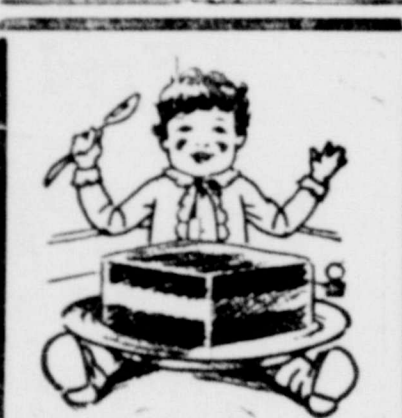

## SAN ANGELO MAN HEADS NEW FIRM

SAN ANGELO, May 19.—Rupert P. Rieker, of San Angelo, a member of the firm of Rieker & Dodson, has been elected president of the Black Arrow Oil Company, organization of which has just been perfected with an authorized capital stock of \$1,000,000. The organization has been in process for several weeks, and was completed in Los Angeles when Mr. Rieker and his partner, Floyd C. Dodson, visited that city. It was announced upon the return to San Angelo of Mr. Rieker and Mr. Dodson and Judge W. W. Hubbard, legal member of their firm. Loren L. Hillman and Carl T. Long, of Los Angeles, and who until a year ago were for five years connected with the Standard Oil Co. of California, are the other organizers of the company. The directors of the Black Arrow Oil Company are: Rupert P. Rieker, president; Loren L. Hillman, first vice-president; Floyd C. Dodson, second vice-president; and Carl T. Long, third vice-president; W. W. Hubbard, secretary and assistant treasurer; and J. E. McConnell, Jr., of Los Angeles, treasurer and assistant secretary. During the past year Mr. Hillman and Mr. Long have been in the oil business in California, operating a company similar to that operated by Rieker & Dodson, of San Angelo. In uniting their forces the two companies have organized the Black Arrow Oil Company in the nature of a holding company for oil properties, and each company will conduct its business as formerly, doing business in Texas and California.
