Buzz Smith was slugged in the head last night between Coleman and Valera, taken from his car, relieved of between \$25 and \$30 and his Chrysler 70 roadster

According to details gathered Saturday morning, Smith was returning to Ballinger about dark Friday night and when about six miles out of Coleman three boys stopped him and asked for a ride. Smith allowed them to get on the running board of his car and two stepped on one running board and one on the other. After going a few miles and before he reached Valera, one of the boys worked his way around and got on the turtle back of the car and without any warning Smith felt a blow on the right side of his head which rendered him unconscious.

What took place Smith did not know until he found himself almost home riding in a truck with a man. The man found Smith lying by the side of the road about ten o'clock and from a letter in his pocket addressed to him at Ballinger he decided to bring him on here. He arrived here with him about midnight and the officers were immediately given the particulars and started working on the case in an effort to apprehend the hi-jackers.

Smith was missing about \$30 in cash which he had in his pocket and his Chrysler roadster was also taken by the three men.

The wound on Mr. Smith's head is not serious and the worst place is a severe cut in his lip where the lip is cut almost through. 




