MEMBER INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Ballinger's office for a period from February 1 to September 30, discloses some very interesting facts. Perhaps the most interesting is the fact that the city of Ballinger is growing and that the water department is getting a fine plant for distributing the water as long as the supply is in the reservoirs.

From February 1 to September 30, 1927, this department collected a total of \$11,473.54 and for the same period in 1928 \$14,410.38. which is a gain of \$2,936.84. This gain figured by the month is \$367.10 per month for the period and is indeed a substantial gain. From the receipts in 1928 there has been spent and paid for in extending the city mains, adding new meters and many other extensions, a total of \$4,176.15. 




