AIR MAIL AND PASSENGER SERVICE OPENED BETWEEN MEXICO CITY AND YUCATAN

VERA CRUZ, Nov. 6 .- An air mail and passenger service has been inaugurated today between Mexico City and Merida, the capital of Yucatan, by the Mexican Aviation company.

The service will be maintained by Fairchild machines of 540 horsepower, capable of carrying four passengers and 200 pounds of mail.

The contract made between the government of Mexico and the concern calls for seven-hour schedule between terminals and includes stops at Vera Cruz, Villahermosa, Ciudad del Carmen and Campeche. The service reduces the present duration of transit by rail and steamer from six to seven days to seven hours. Yucatan and its capital city being without rail connection with other parts of Mexico.


