UIL Realignment Brings New Teams and Long Road Trips

The University Interscholastic League issued the District Assignments and Reclassification Information for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years on Thursday, February 1, 2018. Friona will see some new teams in district play as well as get reaquainted with old district foes. To the best of our knowledge, Friona has never been in a district with Canadian or Spearman.

Friona will compete in football in Region 1, Conference 3A, Division 2, District 3. The Chiefs will be joined in the district by Canadian, Childress, Dimmitt, Spearman, and Tulia. Friona drops from the "large school" division to the "small school" division. Coach Jimmy Arias, athletic director and head football coach, says he feels good about competing at a high level in this classification. He said "Friona will no longer be the smallest school in the state in 3A like we have been the last two years."

The Friona Squaws will play volleyball in Region 1, Conference 3A, District 1. Amarillo River Road, Bushland, Dimmitt, and Tulia join Friona in the district. Bushland is a perennial powerhouse in the sport but Friona should do well in this district and would not have to face Bushland in the first round of any playoffs.

Friona teams will once again be in a crowded district for basketball. Region 1, Conference 3A, District 1 will be comprised of Amarillo River Road, Bushland, Canadian, Dimmitt, Friona, Muleshoe, Spearman, and Tulia. There are many good teams in this district and the competition will be tough. There will be some long road trips and most of the travel will be to the north.

"What Friona Means to Me"

moved from Iowa to the Star Ranch in Parmer County, Texas, close to where Lazbuddie is now. They had eight children while living there and two more after moving about three miles north of Friona. Their children were Mabel, Bud (my Daddy), Faye, Minnie, Edna, Lena, Nellie, Grace, George and Frank Jr. All of the last nine children went to Friona schools and several graduated. Bud Reed, Minnie Knight and Lena Stokes spent all of their lives in Parmer County, most of that in Friona. All of the family is deceased with Frank Jr. dying in November 2017 and Grace in January 2018.

In 1928 Ed & Bessie Boggess moved from Oklahoma to five miles southeast of Friona with their five children: Juanita (my Mother), Irene, Eugene, Geneiva and Thelma. They all attended Friona schools. Juanita married before her senior year and the other four graduated from Friona. All of the family is deceased.

Bud Reed and Juanita Boggess married in 1931 and had three children: Ralph Reed, Patsy (Reed) Bandy and Roberta (Reed) Klapper. The kids started school at Black and

In 1908, Frank and Martha Reed moved to Friona in January 1943. Ralph and Patsy both graduated from Friona and Roberta married.

Eugene Bandy and his family moved to Friona in 1946, when he was a freshman. He finished school and graduated from FHS in 1949. He had worked for Ed and Eugene Boggess while in school and continued after he graduated.

Eugene and Patsy married August 30, 1951 and he continued to work for the Boggess' until he went into the service in October 1952. Patsy was going to school and graduated in 1953. When Eugene got out of the service in October 1954, he came back to the farm and worked for Grandpa Boggess. In November, we moved to the farm and into the house Grandpa had built in the late 1920s. The house was built onto a few times and we lived there and raised our family. They grew up and left home and we stayed there until we bought a house on the highway and moved into it December of 2015.

We have four boys, Johnny, Clay, Todd and Chad. They were all born in the hospital in Friona and delivered by Dr. Paul Spring. Johnny, Clay and Todd all attended Friona

schools and graduated from FHS. Chad was born a special needs child and spent all but the first three years of his life in a State Home where he died in 2006. Johnny went to Angelo State after graduation and started teaching and coaching at Roosevelt. He met and married Carla Searcy in 1981. They moved to Terrell, Texas where he taught and coached for three years. Their son Brandon was born there. They moved to Plano, he taught and coached at Plano East for ten years, then at Richardson Lake Highlands for six years, to Richardson High School for five years, and then to Plano West for nine years where he retired two years ago. Their daughter, Kaci, was born in Plano. They have two granddaughters and they all live in Plano.

Clay went to Abilene Christian for a semester and then came back to Texas Tech after graduating from Friona High School. He married Tamela Hassenpflug, a graduate of FHS, in 1978. They moved back to Friona where they still live. He farmed for a number of years and has worked for other businesses, including his current job at Kendrick. They have three children, all raised in Friona and graduated from FHS. Joseph graduated in 2000, Valerie in 2001. and Adam in 2003. They have two grandsons and one granddaughter.

Todd went to Lubbock Christian for two years after graduating from FHS. He had met Lori Thomas from Tucson, Arizona at school and fell in love and in August 1980, they were married. They moved to Friona where he farmed for several years before deciding farming was not what he needed to be doing. They had a daughter, Chelsey, and a son, Levi, while in Friona. He went to WT while still farming and got his degree in teaching and coaching and has been doing this since 1991. He is now at Floydada, this being his 9th year there. They have a granddaughter and a grandson.

We attend Sixth St. Church of Christ; we have been members there since July 1951. We have many friends who are a part of our church family that we love and so many who have left this home for a new one. We also have many other friends, family, and loved ones in Friona.

I have been here all of my 82 plus years and plan to stay here until God has other plans for me.





Xcel Energy crews make progress in first week of Puerto Rico restoration effort

Texas and New Mexico Xcel Energy employees helping with the Puerto Rico power restoration effort received their first work assignments on Wednesday, and successfully restored service to more than 70 customers on Thursday.

The 16 employees arrived early Tuesday morning in Puerto Rico as part of a larger, 65-person deployment from Xcel Energy's eight-state service area. They are working a 21-day mission alongside linemen from several other U.S. mainland utility companies. A second group of roughly the same number of employees is scheduled to travel to the island once the first group's deployment is complete, and that group will also work for about 21 days.

The Texas-New Mexico crews have worked safely under overcast skies and high humidity. They report that the local people are excited to see the help from other parts of the United States, and have been warm and gracious. The biggest challenge so far has been moving through narrow streets where there is little to no traffic control, but local police are assisting where they can.

On Thursday the Texas-New Mexico crews energized the first two miles of a feeder line they have been assigned to repair, and successfully restored power to 73 customers. Most of this work involved setting poles and rehanging cable that has been in disrepair since the September hur-





Don't you love that feeling after a huge Thanksgiving meal? Your belly is satisfied, the Cowboys are winning (hopefully), your family is around and you enjoy all this from the warmth and security at you or a family member's house. The feeling of being satisfied and secure, surrounded by the Lord's blessings is downright delightful. Psalm 63 comes from a time of difficulty during David's life, and vividly displays the truth that even in the wilderness, one can be satisfied and secure.
