Relief Fund to help the top 26 counties as drought continues

Amarillo, TX - The Panhandle Disaster Relief fund, established to help those affected by natural disasters in the Texas Panhandle, is seeking donations as a devastating drought continues to worsen in the area. As disasters spread across the area, the Amarillo Area Foundation works with local and regional organizations to help offset the burdens left in the wake of the incidents.

In 2017, the fund helped cattle ranchers who were devastated by the March fires that spread across the Panhandle and High Plains. Those fires devastated hundreds of thousands of acres of ranch land

and thousands of miles of fence, killed and maimed livestock and, worst of all, caused the loss of four lives. After the fires were contained, help was needed as quickly as possible.

One hundred percent of donations will be sent directly to those impacted by disasters and can be made on Amarillo Area Foundation's website (amarilloareafoundation.org). Donations are needed immediately as the region heads into the spring season, and the extended forecast does not include rain. It is a critical time to receive donations in order to be able to meet any needs effectively should a disaster arise.

Driving Simulator Prepares County Employees for the Unexpected

County law enforcement and road and bridge staff face hazards every time they get behind the wheel at work. The Texas Association of Counties

(TAC) is helping reduce those risks through its innovative driving simulator. The goal is to use the simulator to reduce cost to the county by reduc-

ing collisions and injuries to county drivers. TAC's driving simulator creates real-world driving conditions in a high-tech environment that repli-

cates situations drivers may actually encounter while on the road.

Studies have shown that driver-training programs effectively reduce risks while educating drivers on safe-driving measures. The simulator training reinforces good driving habits that help improve employee safety and make them better prepared for the unexpected.

TAC's simulator has logged more than 100,000 miles traveling across the state and training drivers at no cost to the counties.

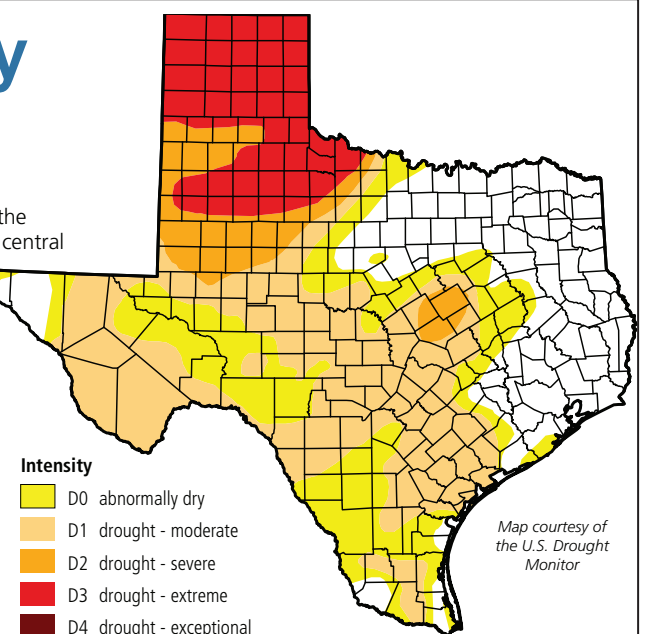

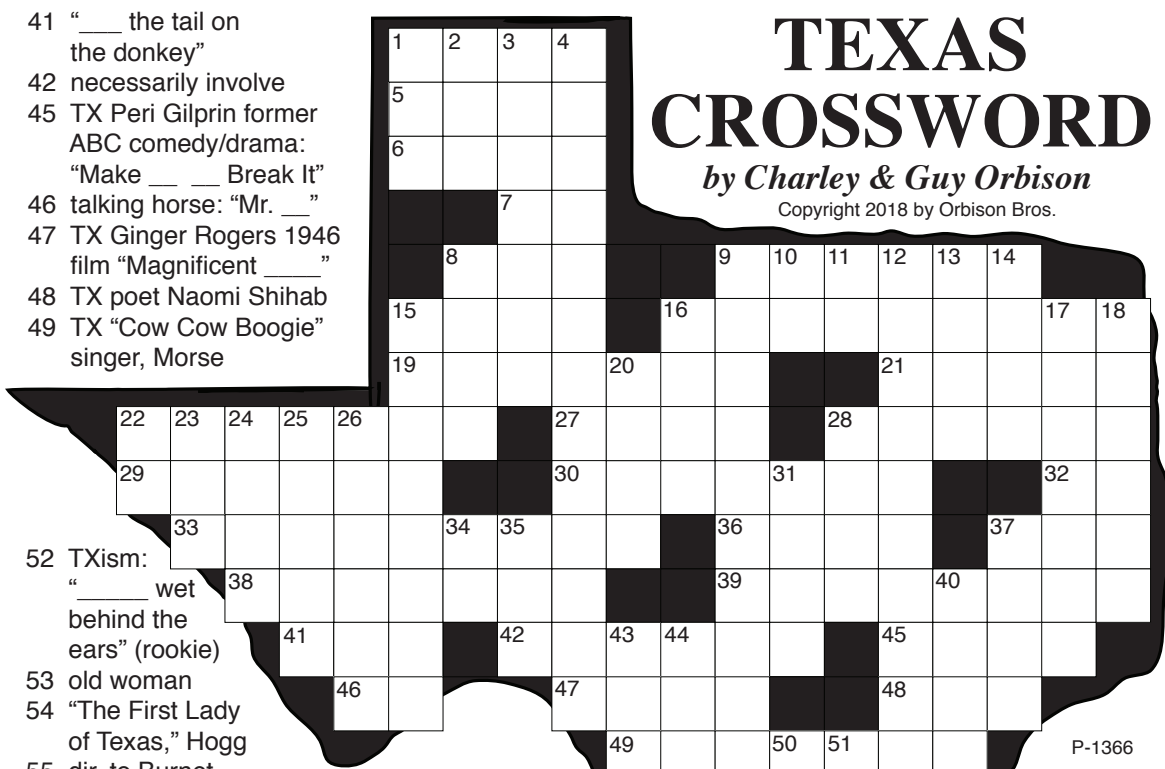

Friona Flashbacks



News from the Friona Star archives in 2002:

JANUARY 4—Friona was treated to a brand new Friona Rural Health Clinic next to the hospital last August, featuring all the latest equipment and shining new offices and waiting rooms.

★★★

MARCH 29—Donice Jones has been a dispatcher at the Friona police department for almost 20 years. In April, at a 9-1-1 Appreciation Day luncheon ceremony in Houston, she will be honored and recognized with a Silent Hero award, one of 83 dispatchers in Texas to be awarded this year.

★★★

APRIL 19—A call to Friona police Saturday night, April 13, brought law officers to the Friona High School parking lot where citations were issued to about a dozen teenagers for possession and consumption of alcohol. The incident happened near midnight Saturday. Officers said 30-40 teenagers were gathered at the high school parking lot, several of them from Hereford.

★★★

MAY 17—A black bear, weighing an estimated 200 pounds, wandered into the Rhea community last Sunday morning, and managed to become "holed up" in an elevator storage tank at Sherley Anderson Grain's Rhea elevator. Joe Allen, elevator manager, said the bear was first spotted about a mile west of the elevator at about 8 a.m. Sunday. He continued walking along the edge of a field that borders FM 1731. Allen and his son Danny "herded" the bear away from some CRP land and toward the elevator.

★★★

JUNE 7—Construction on another large dairy operation for the Friona area is expected to begin sometime this next week, according to a spokesperson for the company. The new dairy will be located approximately nine miles southeast of Friona. It will be a mile south of the "Blackburn corner" and west of the Farm to Market highway. It is also about seven miles south of Black.

★★★

JUNE 21—Last week, the Lazbuddie marijuana case was more or less broken wide open, after an eight-month investigation by the Parmer County Sheriff's department. On October 18, 2001, the Parmer County Sheriff's office had staged a raid on a farm located one and one-half miles from the Lazbuddie school. During the raid, more than 200 pounds of marijuana were recovered from a corn field and a barn on the property. On Thursday, June 13, 2002, District Judge Gordon Green ordered that the Lazbuddie land, a half section (320 acres) be forfeited to the state. This ruling is expected to be appealed.

★★★

AUGUST 16—This week the Friona ISD food service staff had the unenviable task of disposing of thousands of dollars in frozen foods ruined as a result of the failure of the district's frozen food storage unit. A system malfunction resulted in the thawing of all items stored in the unit. Items included processed commodity items such as pizzas, turkeys, chicken nuggets, meat patties, and other assorted fruit products. None of the affected food items will be served in school cafeterias.

★★★

SEPTEMBER 27—Thursday, September 19, around midnight, Parmer County Deputy Andy Stormes stopped a pickup pulling a trailer in Bovina when the trailer had a defective light. Acting on a suspicion, Stormes asked for, and was given, permission to search the vehicle. During the search, the deputy found packets containing cash. When questioned, the driver said the money was not his and he did not know who it belonged to. Stormes confiscated the money, \$119,821, and the driver was allowed to go. He was assisted during the search by Deputy Steve Bartley and the county drug dog, Arno.

NOVEMBER 8—The Friona ISD Cafeteria would like to help Friona residents with their holiday baking by making rolls. The rolls will be frozen, ready for baking and will cost \$3.00 per dozen. Just thaw the rolls, let them rise, bake and serve.

City Hosts Seminar on sexual assault investigations

The City of Friona, in conjunction with the Texas Association Against Sexual Assault (TAASA), hosted a free seminar for local and area law enforcement officers, victim advocates, district attorneys, and other interested parties on Monday, March 19th at the Redeemer Literacy Center. The training course was titled "Sexual Assault Investigations - From the



Crime Scene to the Courtroom." Course instructors were Sergeant Michael Crumrine of the Austin Police Department and Detective Kim Farbo, a retired Austin PD officer and current TAASA Training Coordinator.

Since sexual assault investigations are considered to be some of the most complex investigations, the training highlighted common myths and misconceptions about these cases, as well as how to understand the rape culture and its effect on society. The course also instructed the participants on best practices in regards to victim and suspect interviews. They also learned how to explore what evidence can be collected in sexual assault investigations, how to do so, and what that evidence can and cannot tell an investigator. Additionally, the course covered the neurobiology of trauma and its effect on memory and explored pretext communications (cell phone, computer, phone apps, etc.) and their value in these investigations.

Around 6.3 million adult Texans have been sexually assaulted in their lifetime. 413,000 adult Texans have been assaulted in the past year. Sexual assault crimes cost the state \$8 billion and the state incurs a cost of \$42.8 million annually in services for victims. That costs each Texan \$340 per year. Ninety-seven percent of all sexual assaults involve no weapon and most assaults are committed by persons known to the victim. This seminar was very timely since the city of

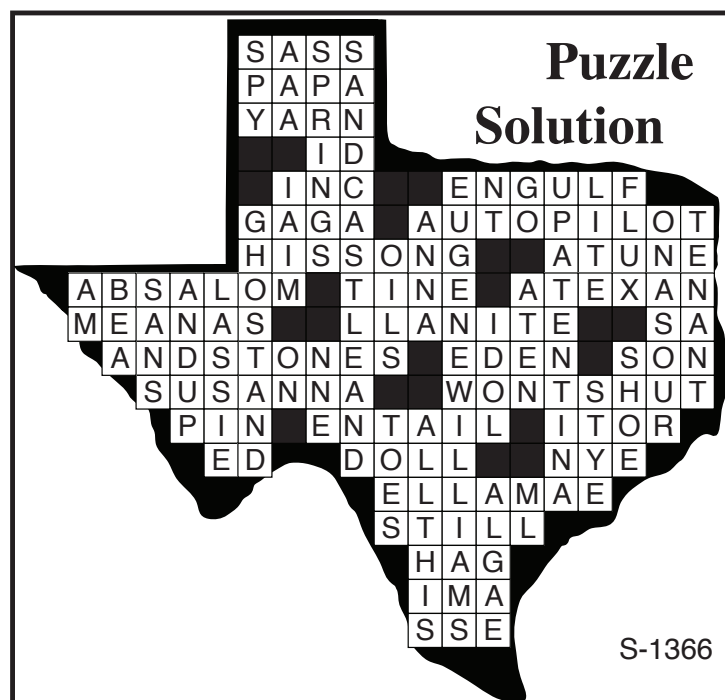
Friona and surrounding areas have seen a rise in the number of sexual assaults.

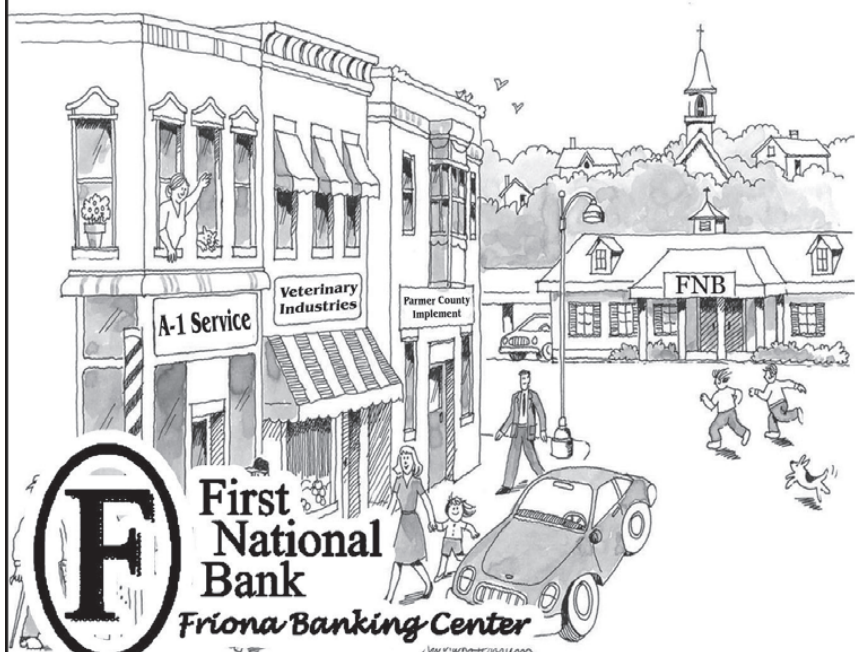

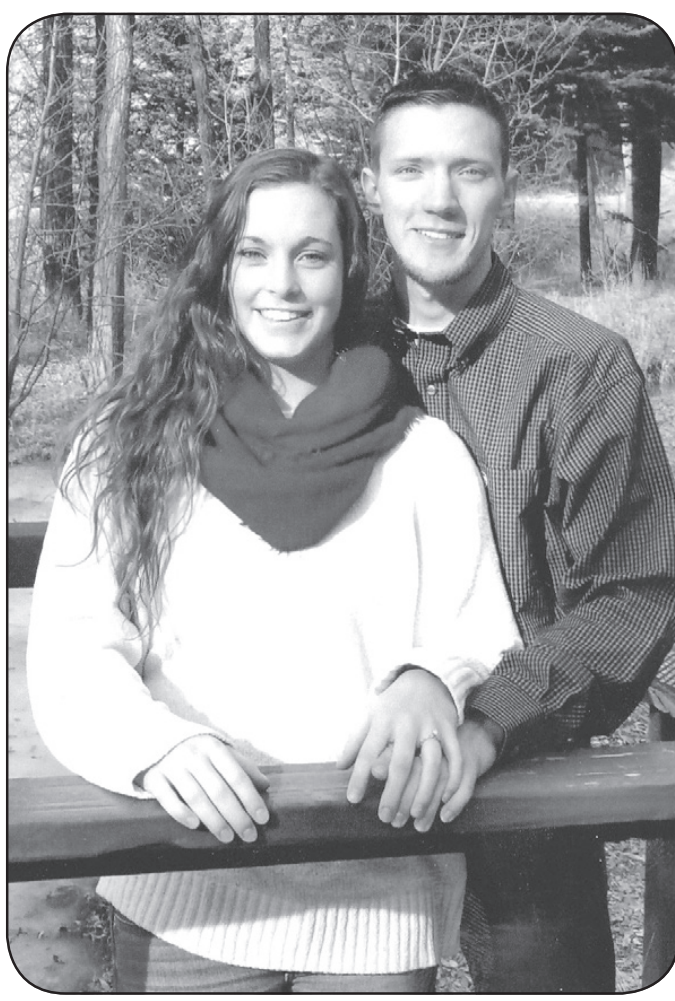

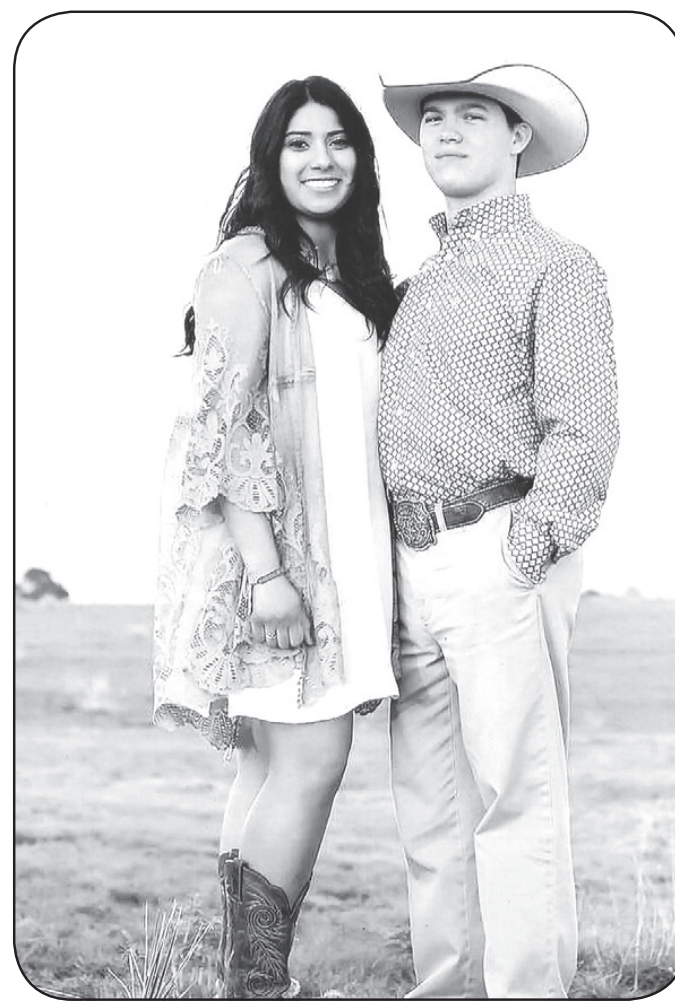

Playa Field Day returns March 27

The second Playa Field Day of the spring season open to landowners and the interested public will be held Tuesday, March 27 from 9:30 a.m.-1 p.m. at South Plains College-Reece Center, Building 2, Classroom 233 located at 506. South Gilbert Drive just west of Lubbock.

According to Darryl Birkenfeld, director of Ogallala Commons, one of the sponsors for the event, the field day will cover general playa characteristics, playas in a changing climate, accessing playas for habitat biodiversity, best management practices, and playa restoration programs.

"Playas are shallow, rain-fed seasonal wetlands dotted throughout the Great Plains. When wet, playas provide crucial habitat for many wildlife species that depend on water to survive. When dry, playas also support several other Great Plains wildlife species because they often provide the only natural habitat in a region dominated by agricultural production. Playas also recharge water to the underlying Ogallala aquifer, filter nutrients and chemicals from the surrounding watershed, and add recreational value to the region. Climate extremes and changes pose an additional threat to already vulnerable playa ecosystems," Birkenfeld explained. Following coffee and re-

freshments, the session will begin with an overview of the day, followed by a presentation by Rachel Owen from the School of Natural Resources, University of Missouri-Columbia on "Playas in a Changing Climate."

Don Kahl, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Region 1 migratory game bird specialist, will then speak on the Texas Playa Conservation Initiative.

At 11am, the group will depart for a Field Trip to visit two nearby Lubbock County playas that have been restored through the Texas Playa Conservation Initiative. Participants will then return to the Reece Center classroom and a sandwich lunch will be served at 12:30 p.m. that will include a wrap-up session to be led by the presenters. The workshop will adjourn at 1 p.m.

Along with Ogallala Commons, the workshop is co-sponsored by the Lubbock-headquartered High Plains Underground Water Conservation District and Texas Parks & Wildlife Department. Those attending are asked to wear clothing, footwear, and a hat suitable for the field tours. There is no charge for the event, though a \$10 donation for lunch is appreciated.

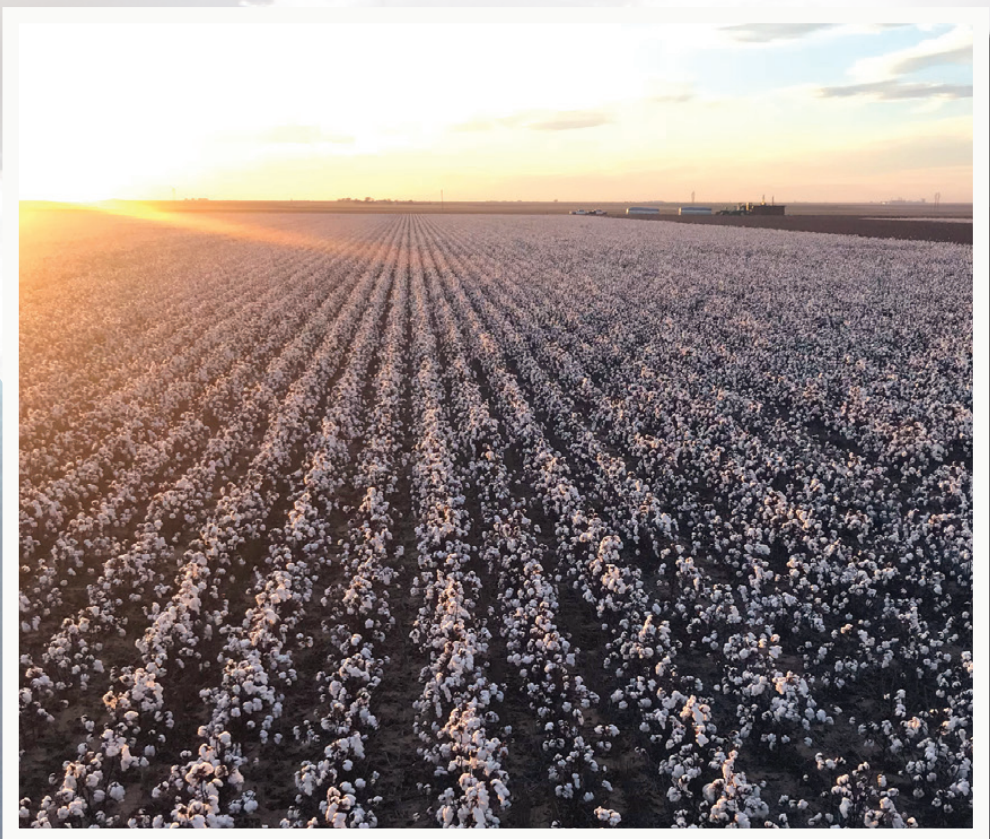
