Gilley wins School Board Special Election

The Board of Trustees of the Friona Independent School District met in a special called session on Monday, May 14th at 7:30 a.m. in the Board Meeting Room of the FISD Administration Building, 909 E. 11th Street, Friona, Texas 79035.

The Board canvassed the election results from the May 5th election. Darrin Gilley was declared the winner for the 1-year at-large trustee position. Darrin Gillev received 225 votes and Corbin Riethmayer received 48 votes. Andy Montana,



Jason Rector, and Antonio Rocha won full terms on the Board. All three ran unopposed. The Oath of Office was administered to all four

The Board also elected officers for the 2018-2019 school year. Becky Riethmayer will serve as President. Andy Montana will be the Vice President and Jason Rector was elected as Secretary. Regular members are Jamie Lewellen, Wade Schueler, Antonio Rocha, and Darrin Gilley.

The Board also met in Closed Session. The agenda for this meeting can be found at frionaisd.com, the FISD website.

County Commissioners renew burn ban

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, May 14 at 10 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. All commissioners were present. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and Texas Flag.

The Commissioners reviewed the Emergency Action Plan for the two Watershed Structures in Parmer County (Bovina and Lazbuddie). Earl Behrends presented the comprehensive plan and it was approved.

The Court considered and approved Duane Oliver as the Veteran's Service Officer. Duane lives in Farwell and is a retired 20-year veteran of the United States Air Force. He was stationed at Canon AFB outside of Clovis, New Mexico.

Next on the agenda, the Commissioners considered the acquisition of the Right of Way for FM 145 access to US 70/84. The railroad bridge has been hit by trucks several times in the past and some The Court approved assuming Continuing Education hours. the Commissioners Court.

10 percent of the right-of-way and 10 percent of the utilities on a project that will re-route the access road. The project is expected to take 2-3 years to complete.

Discussion and Possible action to Designate Reinvestment Zone 2018-01, Establish the Boundaries thereof and Provide for an Effective Date, Pursuant to chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code and Discussion and Possible Action to Nominate Cargill Meat Solutions Corporation for the Texas Enterprise Zone Program Pursuant to Chapter 2303 of the Texas Government Code were both postponed until the next Commissioners Court

The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Next, the Court approved the payment of the Accounts Payables presented to them by County Auditor Larry Johnston. Altha Herington then presented the Treasurer's Report. Commissioners approved the calculated payroll and disbursements for all county employees and elected officials. The Court also approved the County Auditor's actions should be directed to

Next the Commissioners approved an IT project to be installed by Southwest Business Solutions. This computer/internet project will put all of the county information flow under one "domain". This will make it easier to monitor and track all information that flows through the various offices in the Courthouse.

The Court also approved the purchase of a road grader for use in Precinct 1, rescheduled the next meeting for May 29th because of Memorial Day, and renewed the burn ban for ninety days.

The Parmer County Law Enforcement Center was next on the agenda. The Court approved the \$16,000 expenditure to replace the Server and update the computer software. The court then ad-

Animal cruelty arrest made in Parmer County

On May 14, 2018 at approximately 12:00 p.m. (noon) a call was received at the Sheriff's Office in reference to an animal welfare concern. The caller reported animals being transported in u-Haul trucks traveling into Texas from New Mexico. Two trucks were located and

Department and the Parmer County Sheriff's Office, and located inside one truck were 38 dairy goats. The other truck had 7 goats, 58 chickens, 5 turkeys, 3 Guineas, 2 Chinchillas and 4 dogs.

The animals were found to be overheated and in distress with no water, with the outside temperature being 86 degrees and the interior of the truck at over 95 degrees. The animals were reported to being transported from Colorado to Florida. The animals were seized and a veterinarian was contacted for their care. The two drivers were arrested for cruelty to animals and are currently in the Parmer County Jail.

goal is motiving in itself."







Chief Jimenez and the police officers responded to 214 calls in April. There were 119 stops, 53 warnings, 66 citations and 9 arrests. (1-possession of controlled substance, 1-tampering with evidence, 2-evading arrest/detention, 2- no drivers license, 1- harboring a run-a-way, 1-assault on a family member and 1- criminal trespassing). News from the archives of the Friona Star in 2008:

February 14—If you drive by the high school on 7th Street, you'll notice the new Chief on the front lawn. The Indian Chief sculpture was created by Aurelio Castillo of Wichita Falls. It was placed in front of the school Saturday, February 9, 2008. The large son, and Ryan Schwab (joint stone sculpture is a gift to the school from the Class of 2008.

March 27—After 31 years in education, including 11 years coaching and 16 as junior high principal, Kevin Wiseman has decided to retire at the end of the current school year. Mr. Wiseman is a Friona high school graduate. His three grown children are all FHS graduates and his wife Carolyn will continue as a teacher in the FISD.





We are to "hold up the shield of faith to stop the fiery arrows of the devil. Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere."

These words came alive in me when I heard Hunter Willis, age 26, talk about his battle with drugs, mainly speed. He was raised in church; he knew he was doing wrong; he wanted off drugs, but the pull of the devil was just too strong...until he met a minister who encouraged him to do God and

a work of the devil. I hate the devil; I hate drugs; I hate what they do to people and families.

ENERGY STAR® Products set for May 26-28

(AUSTIN) — Texas families and businesses can save on the purchase of certain water- and energyefficient products during the state's Water-Efficient Products and ENERGY STAR® sales tax holidays. Both take place Saturday, May 26, through Monday, May 28.

The Texas Comptroller's office estimates shoppers will save about \$10.7 million in state and local sales tax during the Memorial Day weekend sales tax holidays.

"As of May 1, more than 60 percent of the state was in abnormally dry or drought conditions and anyone who's lived through a Texas summer knows the strain triple-digit temperatures can put on power grids," Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar said. "These two holidays are a perfect time to save on state and local sales taxes while upgrading outdated water systems or inefficient appliances."

This is the third year for the Water-Efficient Products Sales Tax Holiday. Products displaying a WaterSense® label or logo can be purchased taxfree for personal or business use. These include showerheads, bathroom sink faucets and accessories, toilets, urinals and landscape irrigation controls.

The sales tax holiday also applies to lawn and garden products that help conserve water outdoors. Items qualifying for the exemption include soaker or drip-irrigation hoses; moisture controls for a sprinkler or irrigation system; mulch; and plants, trees and grasses. These items can be purchased tax-free for residential use only.

There's no limit to the number of water-efficient or water-conserving products you can purchase tax-free. For more information on the Water-Efficient Products Sales Tax Holiday, visit the Comptroller's website or attend a pre-sales tax holiday kickoff event on May 23, when representatives from the Texas Water Smart Foundation will join Hegar at Home Depot, 1200 Barbara Jordan Blvd., Suite 100, Austin.

During the ENERGY STAR Sales Tax Holiday, certain energy-efficient products displaying the ENERGY STAR logo can be purchased tax-free; these include air conditioners priced at \$6,000 or less, refrigerators priced at \$2,000 or less, ceiling fans, fluorescent light bulbs, dishwashers, dehumidifiers and clothes washing machines.
