Tennis and One-Act Play will be held on April 10, and all other events will be held Saturday, April 11th.

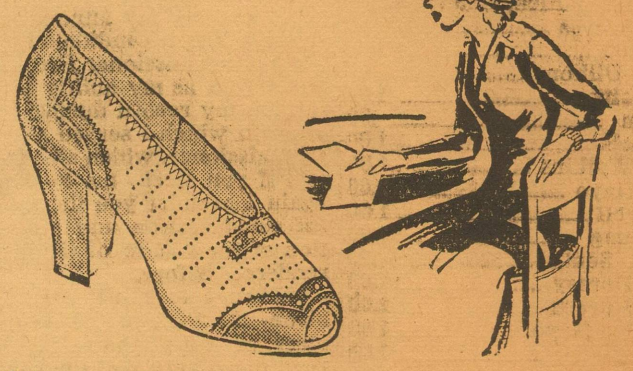
