To this the lawver promptly and pleasingly replied: "It was law, your honor, until your honor just spoke." "If your honor please," said Payne one day, beginning a motion. "Sit down, sir: don't you see I am talking with another justice," thundered the then chief justice. Mr. Payne took his hat and walked out of the court room. A half hour afterward a messenger reached his office with a note sayir - that Justice Gray was willing to hear him. "I am not willing to be heard," answered the old lawyer, "until Gray apolzes."
