Editor Voice:-Since organization now seems to be the leading topic in the minds of the people of Perry County, I will contribute my mite.

The only objections I have thus far hear! to organization are: an increase in texes, a d a possibility that within twelve months a railroad might build through our county, move our County Site and thus incur double expense. Whether or not organization would necessarily increase taxation is a mooted question, but granting this contention, would not the benefits accrueing and to accrue from organization far out weigh the extra costs? I think so. As I see it, organization is the proper step toward progress, developement, the building of schools and churches, and all tending to a higher civilization, and it seems to me that those opposing are season, and by not baering the consciously or unconsciously, placing themselves on record as enemies of these lausable objects. If the benefits of organization are not worth the extra costs it might entail on Terry County, then it is reasonable to infer that the same is true of all other counties in l'exas, and hence, we shall make haste to advise all these counties to disband and go to Austin to transact their business. But if this is a good fiscal policy for a county, then why not for a state? ter? Perhaps our opponents will not care to carry the matter quite sc far, but under their premises where can they stop short and in Terry county at \$3500 still he logical? Seneca, the Roman rhetorician, was able to repeat 2,000 words upon once hearing them, each in its order, though they had no dependence nor connection on each other. Pontius Latro retained in his memory all the orations he had ever spoken, without failing in even a single word. Cyneas, ambassador to the Romans from King Pyrrhus, in one day so well learned the names of his audience that the next morning he saluted the whole senate and all the populace assembled each by his name. Cyrus knew every soldier in his army by name, and Sciulo had a speaking acquaintance with all the citizens of Rome. Herr von Nieublin, a celebrated German scholar, was once clerk in a bank of Copenhagen, in which capacity he gave proof of miraculous memory by restoring, from recollection alone, the entire contents of a leaf in the bank ledger which had been lost by fraud or accident.
