Hogs averaged \$8 20 as against \$6.59 in 1915. Sheep averaged \$6.31, an increase \$1.03 over 1915. Lambs averaged \$8 1 an increase of \$1.34 over 1915. is safe to say that prices in 191 will not fall below those of 191 for finished meat animals.






