He entered the Confederate service early in the struggle and served through the war, after which he returned to Travis county and soon after was married to Miss Anna Morris, who with five children survives him. Two others, a boy and girl, twins, died quite young. Brother Gardner was a farmer and a very industrious man, and it is thought by his friends that this early in his religious life. This official life was such as to commend him to all who knew him, for he tried to magnify his office. He was a very zealous Christian, so much so that if it could be said of any one now, that the "Zeal of thine house has eaten me up," it could certainly be said of him. He believed with all his heart that the "Gospel is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth," and did all in his power for its proclamation.  
 He desired not to be buried here, but to be carried back to Shaw Bend, that his ashes might lie where most of his work was done. His family are all Christians, and though they know he gave up earth to go to heaven, yet they mourn as only those can who have lost the best of friends. He has two sisters here, Mrs. Avery and Mrs. Littlepage, and a sister, Mrs. McCormick, and a brother out west, and a host of friends, and the same God that has conducted him safely home can take care of and save them, and our prayer is that they may commit themselves to Him who careth for them.
