CARADAN.

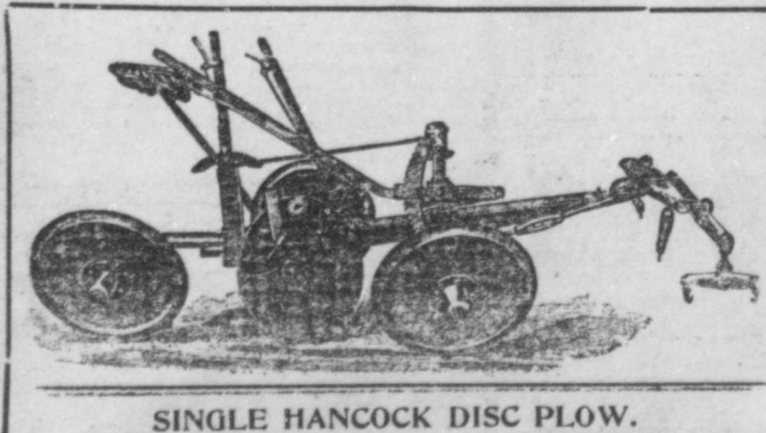
Editor Eagle:
