





He requested the Eagle to give his remedy for blind staggers, which he says was never known to fait. It is to bleed the animal freely from the neck vein. Let blood run antil it begins to get thin, then cut the horse's forehead, just below the foretop, make a slit straight down about four inches and run a finger around in the wound until an opening is formed in which place a considerable amount of table salt and take a few stitches in the cut so the salt will remain in the wound. Cut off about an inch of the tail of the animal. If the blood flows too freely from the wound in the tail it should be checked. Mr. Keyes has tried this plan several times and heartily




