It is this: The executive commit. ee of the county has authority under Section 184 of Article 3093 Re-
vised Statutes, to provide additional qualifications:, that is to say, in addition to the test printed upon the pallot which is: "I am a Demo-
crat and pledge myself to support crat and pledge myself to support
the nominees of this primary ", they the nominees of this primary", they
may also require that persons who may also require that persons who
vote in the primary shall declare that iney are not socialists and that they are not Republicans and that they do not belleve in the pri ciples of either party, They have authority to prescribe this test as
a basis for the qualfications to a basis for the qualfications to
vote in the primary. If any person vote in the primary. If any person
under oath declines to say that he is a Democrat and will support the
inder oath declines to say that he nominees of the primary and that he is not a socialist and that he is not a Republican, he should be denied the right to vote in the primary be-
cause the integrity of the party cause the integrity of the party must be preserved and persons
do not believe in the principles the party holding the primary should ot be permitted to take part in
the primary. If the law was other wise, the law itself would be unconstitutional, because it would vir-
tually destroy political parties by admitting its enemies to come into the party and vote upon the prin. ples winch I advise you that your committe
was clearly withtn its power and was clearly withtn its power and
authority in prescribing an additional gualification to the right to vote in he Democratic primary.
