SHARE IN THE NET PROCEEDS FROM THE STATE PENITENTI-ARY SYSTEM.

House Joint Resolution No. 38 roposing an amendment to Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by adding a new Section providing that the Legislature shall have power to enact laws authorizing a division of the net proceeds arising from the operation of the prison system of this State between the State and prisoners confined in the Penitentiary or their dependents; providing for the submission of a proposed amendment to a vote of the people, and making an appropri-ation ao defray the expense of such election.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding thereto a new secion to be numbered Section 60, as follows:

Section 60. RELATING TO CONFEDERATE PENSIONS AND INCREASING TAX RATES FOR PAYMENT OF

House Joint Resolution No. 35. Proposing an amendment to Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution of the state of Texas to provide that the legislature may grant pensions to Confederate soldiers, sailors and their widows, who have been citizens of Texas prior to Jan. 1, 1910, providing that all soldiers, sailors and their widows eligible under the provisions hereof shall be entitled to be placed upon the rolls and par-ticipate in the pension fund created hereunder; levying a tax of seven (\$.07) cents on the \$100.00 valuation of property in this state for the pay ent of such pension, providing that the legislature may reduce the rate

of pension for such purpose, fixing a time for the election to be held on such amendment, and making appropriation to pay the expenses thereof;

Be it resolved by the legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution of the state of after read as follows:

There hereby levied in addition to other taxes heretofore permitted by constitution of Texas a state ac valorem tax on property of sever (\$.07) cents on the \$100,00 valuation or the purpose of creating a special fund for the payment of pensions for services in the Confederate army and aavy, frontier organizations and the militia of the state of Texas, and for he widows of such soldiers serving in said armies, navies, organizations or reduce the tax rate herein levied And provided further, that the proisions of this section shall not onstrued so as to prevent the grant

of aid in cases of public calamity.
Sec. 2. The foregoing constituional amendment shall be submitted a vote of the qualified voters of this state at an election to be held on Tuesday after the first Monday in November, A. D. 1919, at which all voters shall have printed or written on their ballots, "For amendment of Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution authorizing the legislature to grant aid to Confederate soldiers, sailors and their widows who have been residents of this state since January 1, 1910," and "Against amendment to Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution, authorizing the legisla-ture to grant aid to Confederate soldiers and their widows."

Sec. 3. The governor is hereby directed to issue the proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the constitution and laws of this state, and the sum of five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars or so much thereof as may be neceswise appropriated for expenses of publications and elections thereunder.
