## Park Maintenance Fund Boosted \$244.50 As 20 More Contribute

The Mills County Park maintenance fund was boosted by \$244.50 as 20 more interested citizens joined the honor roll of park supporters during the past two weeks. It was announced Tuesday by W. P. Duren, chairman of the park committee.

Two weeks ago announcement was made that 29 had contributed a total of \$645.00. This brings the total for the main-

tenance fund to \$889.50.

The park committee has a goal of \$1,200.00 for the year to provide caretaker for the park on a year around basis.

Last year the committee raised about \$1,800 which provided up-keep during the past year and took care of the approximately \$600 deficit carried over from prior years.

## April Showers

April showers bring forth the beauty of green grass, budding trees and flowers in abundance; but they also create a danger on the highways which many folks don't realize.

This danger is called "traffic film." It's created when rain combines with the oily greasy residue left on the road by passing cars and trucks.

This traffic film on the highway may last only a half hour or so during a very heavy rain. A light drizzle, however, will

cause a slick surface which lasts for hours. This film is doubly dangerous because it can be as slick as ice, yet it can't be noticed by the eye.

When winter snows and ice cover the highway, drivers normally slow down and use caution; but because they're unfamiliar with traffic film, they don't slow down when rain begins to fall. By the time drivers realize they can't stop or steer properly, it's often too late.

Here are some driving tips that will help minimize the dangers of traffic film:

1. Reduce speed at least 10 miles an hour as soon as you see the first raindrops fall, or when you first come upon a wet road;
2. Test the pavement for slipperiness, when no other cars are close by tapping on the brakes;
3. Stay far enough behind the car in front so it won't spray road grime on your windshield;
4. Make sure your tires have plenty of tread, especially for open highway driving. You might get away with fairly old tires on a dry pavement, but not when it's raining and traffic film might be present.

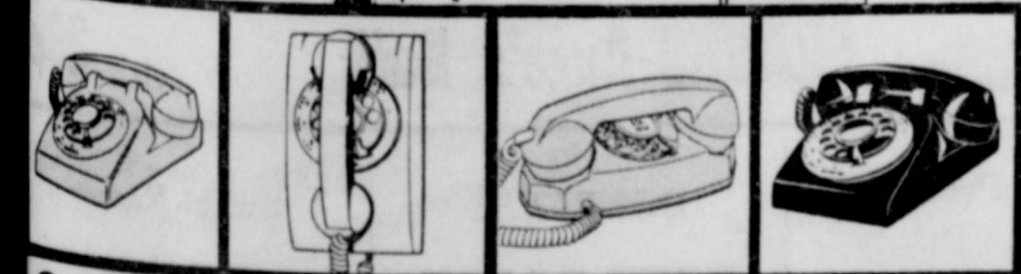

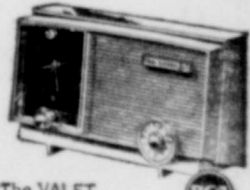

### Sponge As Bug Holder

Small bass bugs and poppers can be a problem out of the water. Where to put them so you can grab one without tangling the others is the question.

A piece of sponge sewn to the crown of your favorite fishing hat provides a handy place to perch your favorite bugs. They are easy to remove and they won't fall out.

### Grips On Sinkers

When fishing a sandy bottom where there's a fast-moving current, getting a sinker to hold is a problem. To solve this, drive a few nails into the soft lead. These "legs" will grip the

soft bottom and anchor the sinker in even the fastest water.

### Tight Drag Stops Snag

Chief cause of tangles with spinning tackle is loose line on the spool. Be sure to reel it under sufficient tension.

### Rubber Boot Anchor

An old rubber boot filled with cement makes a cheap, handy boat anchor. Thread a steel rod in it for an eye.

Being rubber covered the anchor won't scrape, scratch or scar the boat but will hold her steady. Also, it makes a quiet anchor when carried inside the boat.

## Review And Plan Lawn Care For Attractive Lawn This Summer

By **GEORGE REESE**  
Mills County Agent

For an attractive lawn this summer, homeowners should review and plan lawn area. Proper fertilization, watering and mowing are important. Fertilization should continue through the growing season. Start when grass begins to grow using a complete fertilizer. George Reese suggests one having 2 parts nitrogen, one part phosphate and one part potassium for this first application. Apply at the rate of two pounds of actual nitrogen per 1,000 square feet.

During the growing season, apply nitrogen every eight to ten weeks at the rate of one to two pounds nitrogen per 1,000 square feet, for nitrogen is the key element in turf growth. It produces the deep green color homeowners desire.

When watering the lawn, you

should soak the soil to a depth of six inches. This encourages a deep root system that will utilize plant nutrients more efficiently and be more resistant to disease. Light sprinkling produces shallow, weak root systems that encourage weed infestation and disease.

Mowing should be frequent with a small amount of plant growth removed with each cutting. Mow only one inch off St. Augustine lawns at each mowing. St. Augustine should be cut at a height of two inches and Bermuda grass at one and one-half inches.

Lawn mowers should be sharp, the blade should cut the leaves and not shred or crush the tips.

Additional information about lawn care can be found in the Extension publication B-203, "Home Lawns" available at the county Extension Service offices.

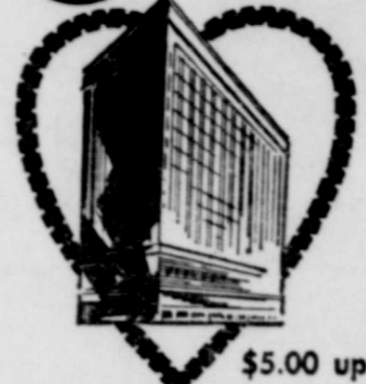

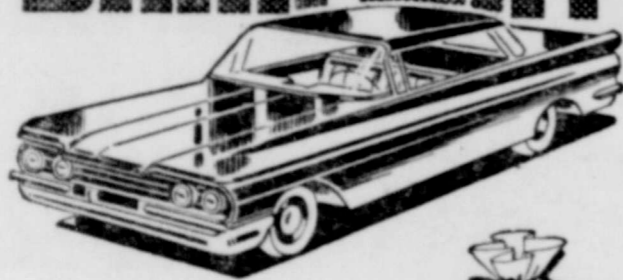

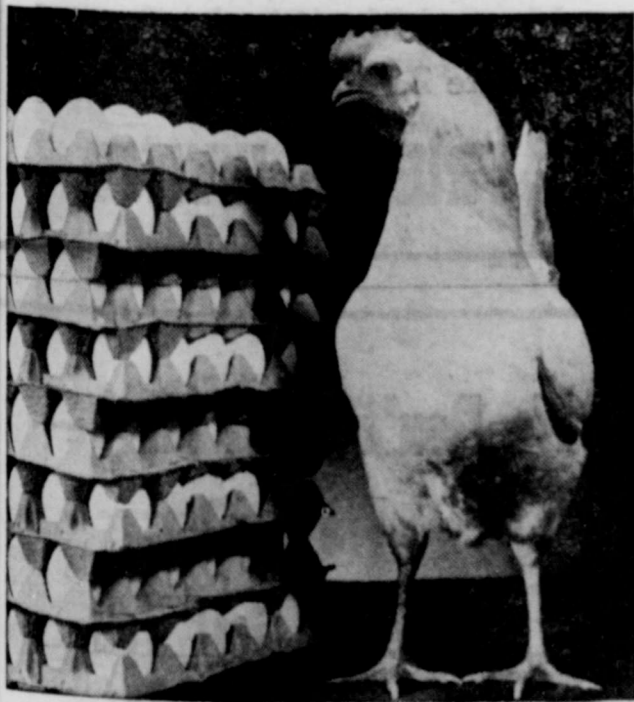

## Farmers And Ranchers Cautioned About Menace Of Screwworm Fly

Screwworms are on the move again in Texas, and livestock producers must take precaution in handling their livestock if they do not want the insects to spread across the State.

Several infestations have already been detected in various parts of the State, and with the coming of spring weather and an increase in livestock management practices, few areas

can be counted completely safe from screwworm attack.

Spring is an ideal period for screwworms because of the mild, moist weather. In addition, such activities as calving, farrowing, and shearing provide thousands of wounds that are open invitation to screwworm infestation.

Many farmers and ranchers are reported not using smears, sprays, or other preventatives, and are allowing their animals to go unchecked and untreated. This practice could quickly result in an explosion of screwworm cases in this county and throughout the State.

Although the statement recently released by the Southwest Animal Health Research Foundation, that screwworms have been eliminated from the over-wintering areas of the Southwest, screwworm cases could occur because of insects migrating into the United States from Mexico. Cases caused by migratory flies, if not detected and treated promptly, could permit the screwworm to become reestablished in Texas, officials point out.

To prevent this from happening producers are urged to inspect their livestock frequently, treat wounds and infestations, collect larvae samples, and report cases immediately so that emergency measures can be taken. Sterile screwworm flies will again be dropped near all cases reported.
