For an attractive lawn this summer, homeowners should review and plan lawn area, Proper fertilization, watering and mowing are important. Fertilization should continue through the growing season. Start when grass begins to grow using a complete fertilizer. George Reese suggests one having 2 parts nitrogen, one part phosphate and one part potassium for this first application. Apply at the rate of two pounds of actual nitrogen per 1,000 square

During the growing season, apply nitrogen every eight to ten weeks at the rate of one to two pounds nitrogen per 1,000 square feet, for nitrogen is the key element in turf growth. It produces the deep green color homeowners desire.


