# Mills County Voters Give Johnson-Humphrey Big Lead

Mills County voters went to the polls Tuesday and joined the rest of the nation in giving the Democratic presidential ticket of Lyndon B. Johnson-Hubert H. Humphrey a big margin for their nationwide landslide win over the Republican ticket of Barry Goldwater-William E. Miller team.

Johnson-Humphrey polled 1,-228 Mills County votes against 495 for Goldwater-Miller.

In the U. S. Senate race county voters gave Democrat Ralph W. Yarborough 1,069 votes against 643 for his Republican opponent George Bush.

Governor John Connally was favored with 1,383 votes over his Republican opponent who received 336.

On the Constitutional Amendments county voters favored all three proposals.

A total of 1,811 votes were cast in the election with a number of ballots not being counted because of improper marking. This was due to split ticket voting on the large ballot. Rainfall late Tuesday didn't seem to effect voting although it was some lighter than the last general election.



### ESUIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT NEWS

Construction is scheduled to begin on Blanket Creek Watershed with the award of the first contract to build three floodwater retarding structures, according to Scott Lanford, Chairman of the Brown-Mills Soil Conservation District board, sites 1, 3, and 4 are being advertised for construction bids and will be opened at 2:00 p. m. on November 19, in the SCS Office at Temple.

Principal bid items in the three floodwater retarding structures include approximately 250,000 cubic yards of compacted earth fill material in the three dams, 4,675 pounds of steel bar reinforcement in 102 cubic yards of concrete and 590 linear feet of spun concrete pipe for the principal spillway installations, salvaging and placing about 31,900 square yards of top soil on embankments and emergency spillways for establishment of grass that will assure minimum maintenance needs by local interests to be provided by the Brown County Comissioners Court, and about 14.700 linear feet of new fencing around dams and emergency spillways for management grazing use on established grass.

All structural costs are provided by the Soil Conservation Service of the Department of Agriculture with operation of the works of improvement being performed by the Soil Conservation District and maintenance by the counties.

### HOME ECONOMICS NEWS

The "pros" and "cons" of tricot bonded fabrics are of concern to consumers. "No linings and easier construction" are echoes of manufacturers of this fabric. Yet consumers want to know if it will serve the pur-

Some important facts are gleaned from research and observance of fabrics on the local market. The greatest majority of these fabrics are wool flannel or mohair, cotton, and nylon looped knit bonded with acetate tricot, Other implications from research are:

With bonded fabrics, because of the chemicals in the bonding. some stains cannot be removed. The acetate tricot has much

poorer strength and abrasion resistance qualities than the wool, and will probably wear out much quicker than the wool

A regular woven fabric, as a lining, is used to eliminate this give and prevent sagging. The tricot, being a knit, will give and allow the wool to stretch. Acetate is a heat-sensitive

fiber and cannot be pressed at the steam setting on the iron, which is used for wool. The backing does give more

body to sheer fabrics and would be quite good on those such as knit mohair to prevent sagging. Acetate has poor colorfastness

and it should be abserved whether change of color in this fabric. backing will affect the outword appearance of the garment. The wool will hold its color well.

Acetate could not be washed without damage, therefore, it would be a poor choice to select it bonded to a washable fabric. The bonded fabrics are easy to handle and would be especi-

Sites 1, 3, and 4 are being advertised for construction bids and will be opened at 2:00 p. m. on November 19, in the SCS Office at Temple.

Principal bid items in the

hree floodwater retarding structures include approximatey 250,000 cubic yards of compacted earth fill material in the three dams, 4.675 pounds of steel bar reinforcement in 102 cubic yards of concrete and 590 linear feet of spun concrete pipe for the principal spillway installations, salvaging and placing about 31,900 square yards of top soil on embankments and emergency spillways for establishment of grass that will assure minimum maintenance needs by local interests to be provided by the Brown County Comissioners Court, and about 14.700 linear feet of new fencing around dams and emergency spillways for management grazing use on established grass.

All structural costs are provided by the Soil Conservation Service of the Department of Agriculture with operation of the works of improvement being performed by the Soil Conservation District and maintenance by the counties.





With bonded fabrics, because of the chemicals in the bonding, the Fellowship Hall of the First some stains cannot be removed.

The acetate tricot has much poorer strength and abrasion resistance qualities than the wool, and will probably wear out much quicker than the wool

Acetate is a heat-sensitive fiber and cannot be pressed at the steam setting on the iron, which is used for wool.

The backing does give more body to sheer fabrics and would be quite good on those such as knit mohair to prevent sagging.

Acetate has poor colorfastness and it should be abserved whether change of color in this backing will affect the outword appearance of the garment. The wool will hold its color well.



This detailed study will require at least three years of field investigation for completion. It will provide valuable information to all cities, industries, and other water users in this important area. Shortly after the study is completed, the Commission will publish a report of the findings which will be available to the general pub-






