GHS Graduation Exercises To Be Held This Friday

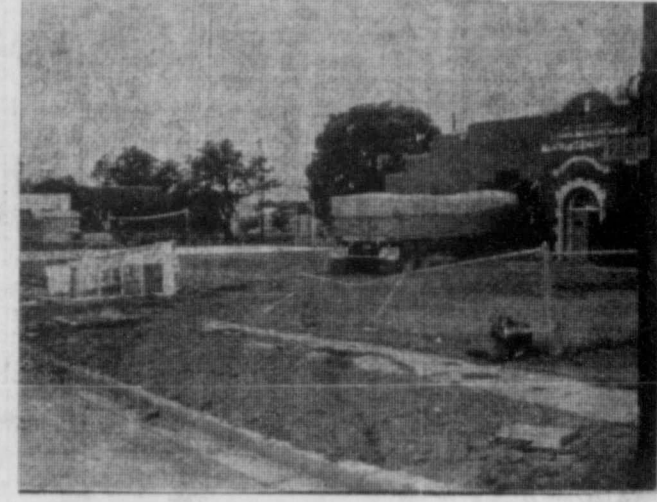
Graduation Exercises for the Goldthwaite High School Class of 1967 will be held on Eagle Field Friday night, May 26, at 8 o'clock.

Four Goldthwaite teenage boys were killed in a car-truck crash here last Friday night at the First and Fisher streets intersection in front of the First Baptist Church and Mills County Youth Center in downtown Goldthwaite.

The 1966 model car they were riding in went out of control on a rain slick road and was struck broad side by a grain truck.

Patrolman Jack Straley and Sheriff H. G. Brooks investigated the accident. They said that three boys, James Leslie Berry, 16, Joseph Walter Williams, 17, and Robert Harold (Bobby) Burns, 17 were pronounced dead at the scene by Dr. C. S. Cruzcosa and Justice Of The Peace E. H. Thorne. Teddy Lee Wilson, 17, was pronounced dead on arrival at Childress & Cruzcosa Clinic & Hospital two blocks from the scene of the accident.

The crash happened about 10:45 p. m. Friday, when the car went out of control on the slick street during a shower and skidded sideways.

A 1957 semi-trailer truck loaded with mlo was driven by Gerardo Delgado Segura, 31, of Schulenburg.

The car was heading north at the time of the accident while the truck was traveling south, going to Flatonia.

The truck was owned by Nikel & Son of Flatonia. The driver told officers he had loaded his truck at Meadow and was headed for Flatonia.

Apparently the driver of the truck swerved some to avoid hitting the skidding car. When it swerved, and after the impact, the truck jumped the curb, sheared off a telephone booth, went through a chain link fence and smashed into the front of the Mills County Youth Center.

The cab of the truck went completely through the front wall of the building and into the assembly room about 12 feet before stopping. The driver was not injured.

Workmen removed the truck from the building about 11 a. m. Saturday.

The car, owned by Burns, was completely demolished by the crash when it was hit on the right side.

All except the Berry youth were thrown from the vehicle.

Charles Blackburn Is Named To Play In Coaches All-Star Game

Charles Blackburn, Goldthwaite's 180 pound halfback, has been selected as one of the players for the North by the Texas High School Coaches Association to play in the North-South State Football Game, it was announced last week. The All-Star game will be played in the Alamodome Stadium in San Antonio on August 4.

Blackburn was one of eight players and two alternates chosen from 236 Class A High Schools.

Blackburn was selected from the North and four boys were selected from the South with Blackburn and South each having an alternate, according to Coach Jackie Williams.

The coaching school will open on July 30, and will continue through Thursday, August 3. The squads will start working at Trinity University in San Antonio Saturday, July 29.

In the past four years, Goldthwaite has had three outstanding players named for the All-Star game. Gene Auldridge was named in 1964, Tom Duren was named as an alternate in 1966 and Blackburn was the selection in 1967.

In the past football season, Blackburn received the following honors: All-District halfback for 1964, 1965 and 1966; All-Mention All-State in 1964 and 1966; All-West Texas in 1964, 1965 and 1966; All-Central Texas in 1965 and 1966; and named to the Super All-State Texas Team in 1966.

Blackburn scored 64 points and had 524 yards rushing during his Sophomore year and as a junior, he made 96 points and had 1,223 yards rushing. During his senior year, he scored 152

points and accounted for 1,267 yards rushing for a total of 312 points and 3,119 yards rushing for his three year high school football career.

In 1966, Charles was Class A State Champion Track Star in the 100 and 220 yard dashes. He still holds the state record in the 220 with the time of 22.2.

Blackburn also ran in the 1966 State Meet as anchor man for the sprint relay that still holds the state record with the time of 42.7.

During the 1967 Track Season, Blackburn had an ankle injury but was able to anchor the Eagles' sprint relay to a Regional win and to fifth place in the State.

He is a 1967 honor graduate at GHS, the son of Mr. and Mrs. T. J. Blackburn, and will attend Rice University on an athletic scholarship.

Livestock Survey Cards Are To Be Sent Out In June

Postmaster Norman Duren reminds rural patrons of the Goldthwaite Post Office to be on the lookout for June Livestock Survey cards. Next week, mail carriers will leave survey cards in a sample of boxes along their routes.

"USDA bases livestock and poultry estimates on replies to this survey," Mr. Duren explains. "It is important for everyone who gets a card to fill it out and return it to the carrier. This way, USDA gets a representative sample of the area's livestock and poultry holdings.

Carriers assisting with the survey are Julian Evans, Route 2 and Delmar Sears, Route 3.

Survey cards will be forwarded to Cary D. Palmer, State Agricultural Statistician, in Austin. After adding and analyzing these cards, USDA statisticians are able to estimate the State's milk production, calf and pig crops, lamb and wool crops, and the number of hens and pullets.

"Information from this survey will guide livestock and poultry producers in making important business decisions," Mr. Duren concludes.
