Next Wednesday Holiday For New Year's Day

Wednesday, January 1, will be observed as a holiday by Goldthwaite business with most retail establishments remaining closed for the day.

New Year's Day is one of the major holidays approved by the state to be observed by stores during the year.

January 1, falling on Wednesday, the middle of the week, will be a short holiday for business and their employees. It will also be the last holiday in a good while with the one coming on Memorial Day.

Brown-Mullin Week Easements Being Signed

The site for a floodwater retaining structure in the Brown-Mullin Watershed has been cleared, according to Douglas SCS, Goldthwaite.

Landowners were involved in this site Bob Reynolds, Ruby Eidson and Mrs. Garner granted easements to the Brown-Mills Soil Water Conservation District last week. Grover Dalton, the landowner, plans to sign easement immediately upon return from Christmas vacation.

The site is expected to be cleared before the project can be approved for construction to start. It seems, says Sellers, that realizing the possibility of going out on this watershed project that people are rallying to the cause and showing a great interest by granting easements.

All-District 9-A Team Selection Includes Eleven Fighting Eagles

The Goldthwaite Eagles placed six members on the first offensive and defensive teams in the All-District 9-A team selection Wednesday night, December 4, when coaches met at Early High School, according to announcement by head coach Leslie Johnson.

Coach Johnson stated the Eagles landed one player on the offensive unit and five on the defensive unit. Cross Plains led the pack with seven all-district choices, three on offense and four on defense. Bangs tied with Goldthwaite, with six

selections, four offensive and two defensive. Santa Anna and Early each placed four men. Santa Anna two on offense and two on defense, and Early three on offense and one on defense.

Ted Roberts was selected all-district offensive back. Paul Kirkpatrick, End, Sam Watson, Guard, Gaylon Jernigan, Linebacker, Mike Wright and Ray Hill, Backs, were named to the all-district defensive team. Sam Watson was the only sophomore named to the all-district first team.

Jody Langford, Center, and Byron Harper, QB, received honorable mention on offense, and Leland Knight, End, Mack Casbeer, Tackle, and Kennon McLean, Halfback, received honorable mention on defense. Harper is a senior, Langford, Knight and Casbeer are juniors, and McLean is a sophomore.

Eagle Completes Year Long Project Of Plant Improvement And Updating

A general improvement and updating program underway for the past year was completed the past week at the Eagle office and printing plant.

The project got underway last January and was conducted along with the regular work schedule of activities of the office and shop over the 12 month period.

It included some improvements on the building, office and printing shop, with most of the emphasis on updating the printing plant facilities.

The exterior of the building was re-painted and new signs painted on the front.

Repairs and improvements were made in the paper stock and storage rooms. Two new storage cabinets were added to take care of the permanent bound files of copies of the Eagle dating back about 60 years.

In the stereotype department the old casting equipment and remelting furnace were replaced with large casting box to take care of casting full page advertising mats. The casting system was changed from the old type high style of cast to a shell cast system for time saving and efficiency.

The composing room with make-up department was com-

pletely redone. Equipment added included an additional power metal saw, strip material storage cabinet, ad assembly cabinet, job storage cabinet with 100 galleys for printing forms, eight new gray granite make-up stones with all new custom made stands and cradles, a custom made hydraulic turtle for moving the heavy double page printing forms to and from the newspaper press, new printing material storage racks, more type cases, and rebuilding an assortment of tables and storage facilities.

In the mailing department a new custom made cabinet was added to hold the many mailing galleys containing all the names of Eagle subscribers.

A new electric paper drilling machine with custom made stand was added in the bindery department.

In the office a new custom made advertising mat storage cabinet with work space was added.

The general improvement and updating of plant facilities were made in keeping with the policy of Eagle publisher Vic E. Kolerber to give the community the best possible newspaper and provide the best service possible to customers in commercial printing, office supplies and furniture.

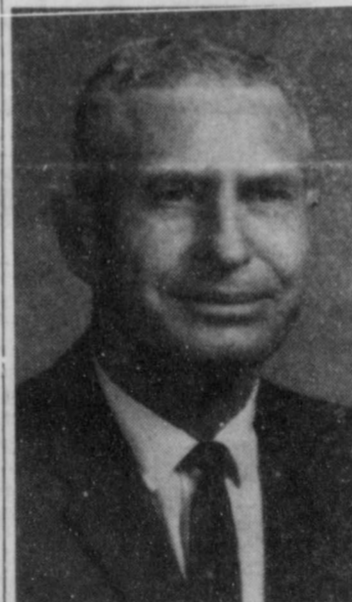
It reflects good faith in the community and the economic future outlook for Goldthwaite and Mills County, on the part of the newspaper and its publisher.

There will be a Singing at the Ridge Schoolhouse this Sunday, December 29, from 2:00 until 4:00 p. m. Everyone is invited to attend.



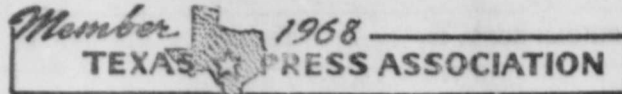
