





Sales in Texas during October were \$14,409,900 and sales for the 10-month period totaled \$143.528.569 for 87 per cent of the 1969 goal of \$170.1 million.

Over the nation, sales for the month were \$438 million -24-year peak for any October and 2 per cent higher than a year ago. The January-October sales totaled \$4,066 million -83.6 per cent of the national goal of \$4,861 billion.
