The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association will sponsor a Feeders' Symposium at the Hotel in San Antonio, Wednesday, January 14, 1970. Registration will start at 9:30 a. m. and the program will feature a panel of speakers and their subjects are as follows:

Dr. Millard Calhoun — Lamb feeding in general; Dr. H. R. Crookshank — Water belly or urinary calculi; Dr. Zerle Carpenter — Dual grading system; Dr. Maurice Shelton — Over-eating disease; Dr. Joe David Ross — Parasites.

Following the formal presentation, a question and answer period will be held to give those present an opportunity to work out their particular problems.

"Lamb feeding is fast becoming a major industry in West Texas," states Roy Jacoby, chairman of the TS&GRA Lamb Committee. "Because of this the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Lamb Committee recognizes the need to try to keep the lamb feeders informed of all new developments. Why should we send our lambs out of Texas to be fed when we have an abundance of good grains and choice feeder lambs right here to work with," he concluded.

District Social Security Office Marks 30th Anniversary Dec. 18

The staff of the Abilene Social Security Office marked the 30th anniversary of its existence with an open house and coffee-cookie affair Thursday, December 18, according to R. R. Tuley, Jr., District Manager.

Mills County has been part of the district served by that office for the entire 30 years. Jim Jordan, field representative, makes regular visits here in an attempt to furnish the same quality of service and help afforded in the Abilene headquarters for this 15-County district. Jordan's schedule of visits is always posted at the post offices in the county and published in The Eagle.

On December 18, 1939, no monthly benefits were being paid; in fact, none were paid until February of 1940, when the checks for January were delivered. In December of 1969, over 1,100 persons, in Mills County, received some \$78,000.

In December 1939, only retirement and survivor claims were slated for January payment; today, disability benefits, student benefits from 18-through age 21, Medicare for those past 65, payment as early as age 50 to a disabled widow, or at age 60 if not disabled, retirement benefits at age 62 instead of 65 are possible.

The chief message from the Abilene social security staff as the start their 31st year is, "Don't guess about your social security; get the facts from a representative when in your area or write the office in Abilene."

County Voter Registrations Are Moving Along

Voter registrations in Mills County are moving along and have reached about the half way mark of the potential voter strength, according to H. G. Brooks, Sheriff and Tax Assessor-Collector.

Brooks announced Monday that 1,254 had registered to vote up to Monday noon. The total voter strength of the county is approximately 2,500.

Over \$12,000 In Taxes Paid By TRA On Property In Mills County

Current annual taxes paid to the various government agencies by Texas railroads in Mills County totaled \$12,769, it has

been announced by the Texas Railroad Association. That amount was the county's share of the nearly \$11,000,000

the railroads paid in Texas on their right of way and other property.

The biggest railroad contribution was to the school systems throughout the state. Large sums were also distributed to city, village and county governments and for road and bridge funds.

In addition, of course, was the large total in taxes the more than 30,000 railroad employees in Texas contributed on their own property. The vast majority of rail workers, many of whom live in Mills County, own their own homes.

"We are very pleased that nearly half of the taxes paid by the railroads in Texas go to support the schools," said Walter Caven, general counsel of the Texas Railroad Association. "The future of our country depends to a great extent upon the education of our youth," he said.

"Recognizing this need for education, many of the railroads operating in Texas also continue to make scholarships available to a large number of students every year."

Henry Hopper Receives Citation For Water System Work Proficiency

AUSTIN — An official State Health Department citation for work proficiency has been awarded to Henry Hopper, plant operations specialist for the Friddy water system.

of the Texas Water Utilities Association, the certificate of competency is awarded only to those utility plant operators who have successfully demonstrated their skill and knowledge in modern principles of plant management.

To qualify for certification, a plant operator must have accumulated a prescribed amount of actual work experience. He must also have attended both regional and statewide short schools at which the techniques of water treatment and waste water disposal are taught, and must have passed an examination given by State Health Department sanitary engineers.

State law requires that at least one operator per shift be certified for competency by health department engineers, but many operators seek certification on their own time and at their own expense to increase their efficiency as key public servants to their community and state.

The engineers said the attainment is evidence of Hopper's efforts to better prepare himself for the duties of his profession.
