## Chilli Smith Chalks Up Enviably Record As Swisher County Agent

Swisher County Agent Chilli Smith who has resigned, effective August 1, will return to A&M University to complete work on his Master's degree in Agricultural Education.

Smith has served as Swisher County Agent since January 15, 1962. He joined the Extension Service August 15, 1956, as assistant agent in Navarro County. On November 1, 1959, he was named agent in Chiles County where he served until becoming agent in Swisher County.

Smith has been serving as agent in Swisher County for nine months to win a spot in National 4-H Congress in Chicago, nine boys to win the State Tour sponsored by the Swisher County Extension Service, five boys to win College Scholarships, five girls to be recognized as outstanding 4-H leaders in the state of Texas. He has had nine members to be on the 4-H Council. There have been a number of grand champions and reserve champions, lambs, and swine shown in major shows during Smith's tenure as county agent. He was named by the State 4-H Office to chaperone the Talent Show in 1962 and the trip to National Conference in Chicago in 1968.

Smith has served as Secretary of the Swisher County Activities Association since 1962. During this time he has served on the Extension Committee, worked with the picnic committees, helped with the County Stock Show and Fair. He organized the County 4-H Advertisers Association, County Horse Club, Swisher County Youth Rodeo and the Swisher County Sheriff's posse.

Smith helped organize, and has served on the committee each year for the Memorial Day Steer Contest. Smith has served as Assistant Swine Superintendent of the Panhandle South Plains Livestock Show since 1962 and Assistant Superintendent at the South Plains Junior Livestock Show.

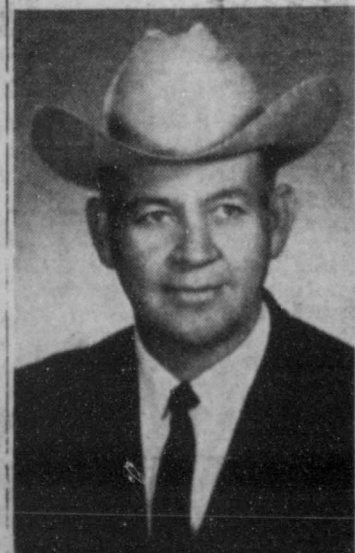

## Project "Toys For The Needy" Announced By Sheriff Brooks

A project has recently been initiated in Central Texas to benefit the needy children in the region, according to announcement by Mills County Sheriff, H. G. Brooks.

This project is a unique venture involving the youth in the Texas Youth Council facilities at Gatesville, Texas. Available technical-vocational equipment at the schools and available manpower will be used to repair and restore toys obtained from donations by local persons in the region. Upon completion of the toy repair project, newly re-conditioned toys will be distributed or returned to charitable organizations in Central Texas to be given to needy persons.

The Texas Youth Council (TYC) facilities at Gatesville have been designated as repair agencies of used toys for needy children throughout Central Texas. To provide this worthwhile service for surrounding communities in collection and repair of the toys, it is necessary that the Texas Youth Council facilities have these toys in their possession prior to August 1, 1970, in order to repair and distribute to charitable organizations throughout Central Texas prior to Christmas, 1970.

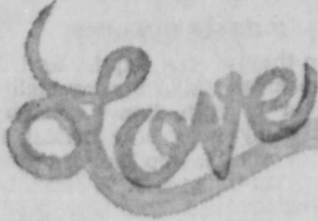

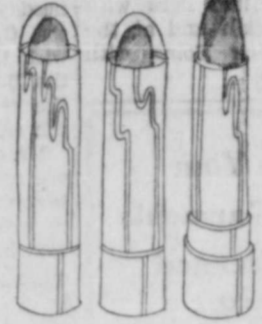

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Section 51, Article XVI, Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to read as follows: "Section 51. The homestead, not in a town or city, shall consist of not more than two hundred acres of land, which may be in one or more parcels, with the improvements thereon; the homestead in a city, town or village, shall consist of lot, or lots, not to exceed in value Ten Thousand Dollars, at the time of their designation as the homestead, without reference to the value of any improvements thereon; provided, that the same shall be used for the purposes of a home, or as a place to exercise the calling or business of the head of a family; provided also, that any temporary renting of the homestead shall not change the character of the same, when no other homestead has been acquired." Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1970, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment increasing the value of the homestead which is exempt from forced sale."
