Wittenburg has appointed Glenn Love, owner of Mills County Commission Co., of Goldthwaite, to be Wagon Boss for Mills County. As a Wagon Boss, Mr. Love will aid area ranchers and other interested persons in making donations for the 72 boys at West Texas Boys Ranch. Mr. Love stated Monday that a sale of livestock donated for this project will be held at the Commission Company here next week Friday, May 21. Hail Storm, Tornado Spawning Winds, Rain, Cause Extensive Damage Here

A fierce hail storm with tornado spawning winds and heavy rain did extensive property damage throughout the city of Goldthwaite and some of the surrounding area last Saturday night. While the hail and winds did their damage the rain brought much welcome relief to the area suffering from dry weather the past several months. Un-official reports of rainfall for Saturday night, Monday morning and Monday night list the amounts up to 2.80 and 3.00 inches. Many rain gauges in the city were reported lost. What many "old-timers" term as the worst hail storm they have ever seen in Mills County came in from the west at 9:30 p. m. Saturday night and pelleted the area for 12 to 20 minutes with hail stones the size of golf balls, hen eggs, tennis balls and even larger. Mills County Sheriff H. G. Brooks and Goldthwaite Mayor

Ray Duren estimated Monday that storm damages within the city will amount to over one million dollars. About one hundred per cent of the homes and many business houses in the city were damaged. A large number of cars and trucks suffered heavy

hall damage with broken windshields and glasses. Insurance adjusters started their work early and apparently it will take some time for them to get every place checked out for estimated damages. Damage in broken windows was extremely heavy on the

church buildings, schools and the courthouse. Some buildings had most all windows on the west and north side knocked out. In many cases the hail stones went through the screens and the windows landing inside. Within the city it appeared that some areas were hit by hail lighter than others. Heavy hail was reported as far west as the Bayou on Hannah Valley Road while north of the highway it extended west several miles farther. The main force of the hail storm seemed to cross Hannah Valley Road just east of the Bayou. Six miles west of the city trees were stripped of all foliage and even some bark peeled off the tree trunks and cedars. The hail at that point went only three miles south of the farm to market road. Hail damage was very heavy from the north edge of the city for several miles east on both sides of U. S. 84. Little or no hail was reported in Star while from Center City south they reported considerable hail. Mullin reported some hail while in the Priddy area no hail was reported. The tornado spawning wind storm with Weather Bureau storm warnings following the hail storm sent most city residents scurrying for safer places. After storm warnings were broadcast by Sheriff Brooks all available storm cellars in the city apparently were filled to capacity while others headed for the courthouse where several hundred gathered in the basement. Brooks traveled over the city with his police siren going to warn residents. City officials and law enforcement officers were in constant touch with the Weather Bureau in Austin giving radar reports in the movement of the storm. The funnel shaped storm cloud moved towards Goldthwaite from the west, northwest and apparently skirted the city without the full force touching ground. Some residents outside the city reported they watched the funnel cloud as it approached Goldthwaite and failed to touch down. It was about midnight when Sheriff Brooks informed those at the courthouse that the weather bureau reported the main force of the storm had passed by and folks could go home. Survey of the damages would indicate that some of it was from a back lash, or circling wind force since some huge trees were uprooted and turned over toward the west. Also the steel spire holding the Cross at the Catholic Church was toppled across the church building roof toward the west, southwest. Part of the roof of A&H Lumber Company yard was blown off. The Lions Club used clothing collection center near the courthouse was turned over and their concession stand located at the show barns was picked up and dropped causing it to virtually explode. A trailer home was pushed off its foundation. Other trailer houses were damaged to the extent that residents had to move out. Several reported from out in the country that some sheds were blown down or overturned. Electric power was knocked out in many places across town because of high winds. City crews worked throughout the night and kept on the job until noon Sunday to restore electric service. Telephone service was disrupted and kept telephone crews on the job restoring service.

Constitutional Amendment Election Will Be Held Next Tuesday, May 18

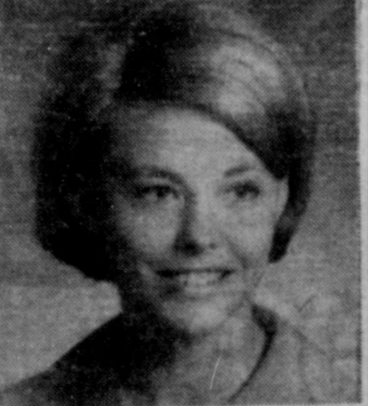

Four proposals will be on the ballot for consideration of voters. They cover subjects on State Ethics Commission, constitutional amendments in called sessions, welfare and water bonds. Mills County polls will be open from 8 a. m. until 7 p. m. in the nine voting boxes in the county. Voters will cast their ballot FOR or AGAINST the four proposals by placing an "X" in the square beside the statement indicating the way they wish to vote. The proposals and order in which they appear on the ballot are as follows. No. 1 — The constitutional amendment to create a State Ethics Commission empowered to set rules of ethics for members of the Legislature, State officers and legislative officers, to investigate violations thereof, and to recommend compensation for members of the Legislature and the Lieutenant Gov-

Savings Bonds Report In Mills County For March

Nationally, sales for the month were \$513 million — 20.3 per cent above 1970 sales, and the highest for any month since January 1963. Sales for the first quarter were \$1,374 million — 28.6 per cent of the 1971 goal of \$4.8 billion.
