School Board Gets Tax Equalization Report, Considers Tentative Budget

The board of trustees of Goldthwaite Independent School District met in regular session Monday night heard a report from the tax equalization committee and considered a tentative budget for the new school year 1971-72 which calls for a 15% increase in tax rate, according to announcement by Gilbert Davis.

The board of equalization had in session and had gone over the tax roll making a few changes and coming up with the same valuation as last year.

The school board, being faced with increased costs, found it necessary to raise the tax rate from \$1.55 to \$1.65 per one hundred dollars valuation. The increase was \$1.55 for the past year with 15c going to pay off indebtedness and \$1.40 for local maintenance. Before the rate was \$1.80. With the new rate of \$1.65, 20c will be bonded indebtedness and for local maintenance.

Davis stated that the fund assignment set by the district to pay for the year has increased \$3,000. In order to provide proper maintenance of the school plant it is necessary to adjust the rate. The 10c increase represents approximately six per cent increase in the taxes.

Davis pointed out further that the district is faced with many of fixed expenses that are going up and the school board is taking action in order to provide the best educational advantages possible.

Other business the board considered the school insurance plan for students which is annual and awarded the athletic laundry contract to the Cleaners for next year.

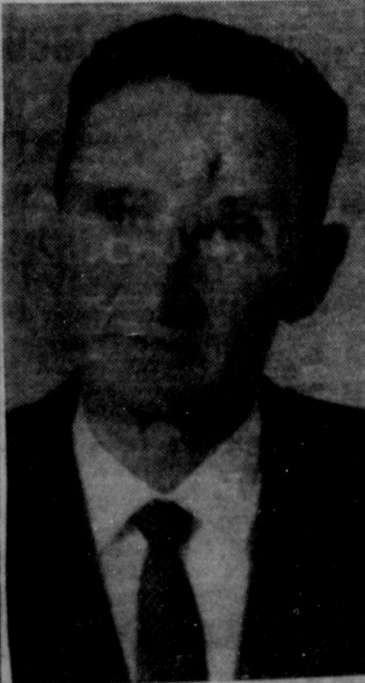
The board accepted a resignation from David Hagler who had been employed as assistant principal and teacher. This leaves opening on the faculty.

Rainfall Covers Parts Of County Tues. Afternoon

Rainfall ranging from one-half inch up to 2½ inches covered Goldthwaite and parts of Mills County Tuesday afternoon.

The Eagle rain gauge on Hanna Valley Road measured 1½ inches while a few miles north of the city they reported 2½ inches. Star reported one-half inch of rain. Considerable light hail was reported northeast of Goldthwaite. Five miles southwest of Goldthwaite 1½ inches of rain was reported.

Maintenance Fund Drive Begins As Park Committee Plans For 1971

The annual maintenance fund drive for Mills County Park is now underway, according to announcement by W. P. Duren, chairman of the park committee.

Committee members held their annual meeting last Tuesday afternoon in the community room of Mills County State Bank when plans for 1971 were outlined and the ball started rolling for the new year.

Members of the committee who attended were: Harold Yarborough, W. P. Duren, Ed Thornton, Charles Conradt and Houston Duren. Also attending the meeting were City Manager W. C. Barnett and Vic E. Koleber. Lee Roy Stacy and Lewis T. Hudson, other members of the committee, were unable to attend.

Chairman Duren presented finance report for the past year which showed the park fund has a balance of \$369.00. By the end of this month, June 30, the committee will need to make payment of \$600.00 to the city to meet cost of the first half of the year for park upkeep.

Last year the committee raised \$1,399.00 and spent \$1,692.27 on the park project. Expenses included one half of the cost of a new bridge.

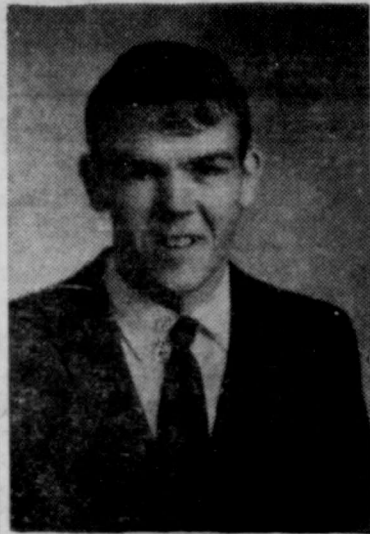
Due to the many other finance drives and income tax season in April, the committee waited longer this year to start the annual drive.

Committee members are now ready to receive contributions from all who are interested in the welfare of Mills County Park.

The committee needs a minimum of \$1,200.00 for the caretaker alone to provide park maintenance. The City plays an important part in the park project each year with respect to roads and other details of upkeep. City Manager Barnett reported that the city purchased a new mower for the park last year and spent a considerable amount in addition to the \$1,200 that is raised by the committee for maintenance.

Ninety-nine interested citizens contributed \$1,302.00 to the maintenance fund last year. This was done without personal solicitation on the part of the committee and reflected again the splendid countywide interest in the park. Some contributions came from points outside Mills County.

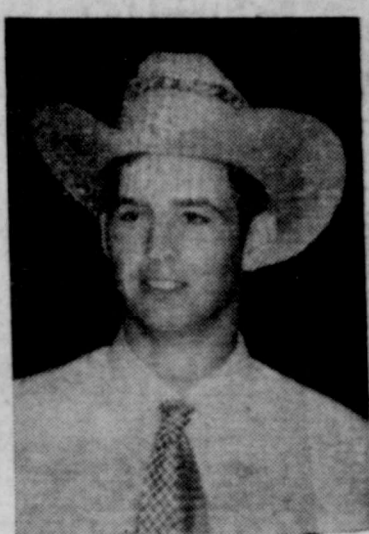
The park is in splendid shape and is being used and enjoyed by many local residents, civic groups, clubs, and family re-

FFA 13th Annual Invitational Rodeo Begins Today With Parade

Goldthwaite's 13th annual Invitational Rodeo, which is sponsored by the local FFA Chapter, opens tonight and will be held Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, June 17, 18 and 19.

Thursday afternoon (today), a big street parade will be held at 5:00 o'clock. The parade will begin at the elementary school grounds. All schools invited to participate in the rodeo are urged to have as many horseback riders in the parade as possible.

FFA Advisor and vocational

agriculture teacher, Thurman Head, and Jack Edington, President of the Mills County Rodeo Association, promise three nights of exciting action for rodeo fans.

Each night the performance

will get underway at 8:30 p. m. in the FFA Rodeo arena north of the elementary school.

Business firms and civic groups are invited to participate in the parade with floats and other suitable entries, according to announcement made by Edington and Head. The members of the FFA Chapter will appreciate the support of everyone taking part in order to help make this a successful rodeo.

Events for the three nights of the rodeo include: Wild Horse Race, Calf Roping, Barrel Races, Ribbon Roping, Breakaway Roping, Calf Riding, Goat Sacking, and Bull Riding.

Goldthwaite, host, has invited eighteen schools to participate in the rodeo. They are: Star, Priddy, Mullin, Richland Springs, Brady, Rochelle, Blanket, Comanche, Evant, Pottsville Early, Bangs, Brownwood, Lometa, Zephyr, San Saba, Gustine, and Hamilton.

Ribbons will be presented to the first five places each night and trophies will be given to the three top teams. Overall winners in each event will be awarded individual trophies.

Boys and girls who are enrolled in the seventh grade and under are eligible for the grade school events.

Contestants for high school events must have been enrolled in the 8th-12th grades inclusive, during the 1970-71 school year.

Participating schools are encouraged to have as many horseback riders as possible in the parade and in each night's grand entry.

Congressional Redistricting Shuffle Places Mills County In District 11

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Congressman Omar Burleson today commented on the Congressional Redistricting just completed by the Texas Legislature. "By legal necessity," he said, "the State Legislature has just gone through the most difficult job of reapportioning Congressional Districts on the basis of population. The outcome of these adjustments on the basis of population is never calculated to please everyone and, as a matter of fact, they seldom please anyone completely. The Legisla-

ture does the best job it can, and it is no easy one."

In Burleson's statement he laments the fact that Mills County was removed from his Congressional District. It was placed in District 11.

His continuing statement follows: "It has been my contention that factors other than population should enter into the consideration of drawing lines of Congressional Districts. The Courts, however, have held that population controls. It is my feeling that the interest of good government is not served unless a community of interest is maintained in a representative District. I also feel that the people's Representative in Congress should know those whom he represents and they should know him. To lose constituents with whom I have worked for a great many years is like losing something real personal and tangible. I put representation in the Congress of my constituents on a very personal basis. I like

to know not only the interests of the broad community but the problems, the opinions and the attitudes of the individual."

"I regret exceedingly that I will not have the privilege of representing the people of Mills County after the 92nd Congress, but I shall maintain a personal interest in the communities and hope to keep contacts with the valued friendships established over this period of time."

Mills County will be represented by Congressman Bob Poage of Waco.

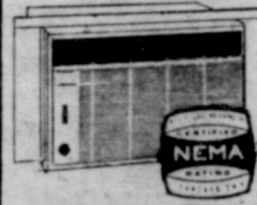

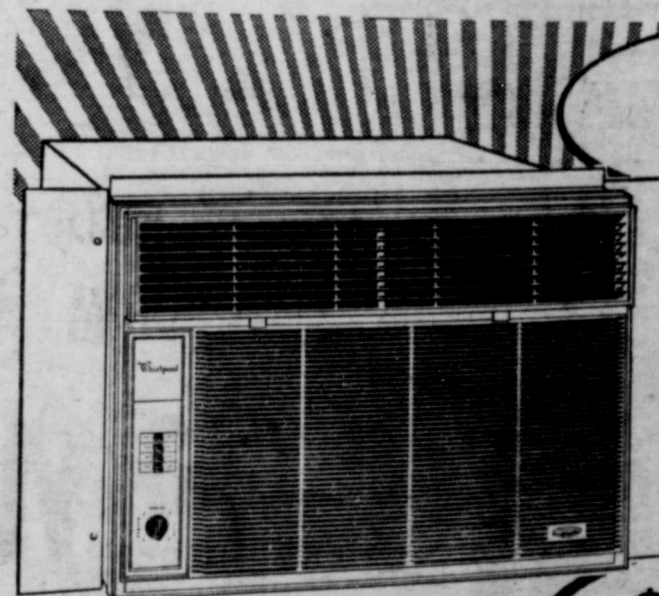
