





Officials of the Mission Screwworm Program report that 24 cases were confirmed last week making this the worst week since the last week in December, 1968. Texas thus far has recorded 138 cases for the year with the entire U. S. count at only 161. And the situation could worsen, according to officials. Screwworm outbreaks traditionally occur in late summer and fall, so producers should check their animals periodically and treat any wounds found. Spraying of herds is also recommended and operations such as castman-made wounds should be put off until winter if possible.

Any larvae collected from wounds should be sent to the Mission Screwworm Laboratory for identification. The mailing address is Box 969, Mission, Mrs. Fred Mosier is visiting in Texas. Collection kits and vials are available from my office.
