Graves Installed As Board Member For Boy Scouts

Dr. T. C. Graves of Goldthwaite was installed as an executive board member for Region 9 of the Boy Scouts of America at their annual meeting which was held at the Stalter Hilton Hotel in Dallas this past weekend.

More than 700 volunteers from a three state area covered by this region attended this meeting. Chief Scout Executive Alden Barber of the National Office of the Boy Scouts of America delivered the keynote address at the banquet Thursday night.

Those attending from the Comanche Trail Council besides Dr. Graves were Harold Yarborough, president of the Council and Warren Duren of Goldthwaite.

Council Ponders Sewer Problems

Recent heavy rains have caused problems in Goldthwaite's sewer system. Excess water is infiltrating the system and overloading and backing up the system, even to the point of coming out of man-holes.

At the Goldthwaite City Council meeting Monday, City Manager W. C. Barnett said a thorough investigation is underway to find the problem. He said there must be a large opening somewhere to cause so much water to be present in the system just minutes after rain begins to fall.

Steps can be taken to remedy the situation after the leaks are found, Barnett said.

Councilman Donald Padgett moved to instruct Barnett to do everything he can to find the source of the problem of infiltration of excess water. It was seconded by Ansel Morgan and passed unanimously.

Barnett had invited Bob King, an engineer of Rady Associates of Fort Worth to be present and show slides of new sewer treatment plants. King gave a report on the types, costs, and sizes needed to handle any future needs of Goldthwaite.

Hollis Wiggins moved that the Council undertake a preliminary study on a new plant, since it will take 18 months to two years to get the plans approved by governmental control agencies and actually get a plant constructed and in operation. The motion seconded by Padgett passed unanimously.

A committee of property owners from just outside the city limits on the east part of town were at the meeting.

Question was aired about annexation of the "bill" area and then getting city utilities to the area.

C. M. Barnett reported that at the last meeting an engineering study on getting water for the area showed a cost of \$17,500. This cost would be prohibitive for the City to carry alone, Barnett said.

He suggested that a petition signed by the persons involved be submitted to the council for annexation. This type of concerted action is the only way to act, Barnett added.

Spokesmen for the committee said that cost-sharing could be possible.

Soil conservation Service representatives Charles Studer and N. S. Ward were in attendance to offer the Services' facilities in the event the city wanted to undertake a sanitary land fill garbage system in the future. Studer said that the land fill operation returns the land to use in a few years. The Council thanked the men for their offer of assistance.

Eagles-Bulldogs Tie In District Play 21-21; Host Dublin Friday

Last Friday night the Goldthwaite Eagles and the Ranger Bulldogs battled to a 21-21 tie in District 10-A football action.

Goldthwaite put the first points on the board as Quarterback Johnny Johnson passed 29 yards to Joe Hudson with 10:11 left in the first period. The PAT was good.

Jerry Williamson put the Bulldogs on the scoreboard later in the first quarter by racing 35 yards on a punt return. The extra point was good.

After intermission the Bulldogs took the lead as Billy Fox passed to Austin Chamness for a 60-yard counter. The extra point was good.

James Battles set up Ranger's other tally by stealing a Johnson pass and returning it to the Bulldog's 48. Five plays later Fox found Mike Myers open and the results was a 37-yard TD play.

At this point the Eagles were trailing by 14 points, but their comeback was great.

With only 5:17 left in the game on a crucial fourth-down play Johnson ran for a six-yard touchdown. He passed to Reggie Robbins for the last TD of the game with just 29 seconds showing on the clock.

The Eagles were overpowered on the extra point kick by the Bulldogs which left the game tied 21-21.

Lions Club members reviewed the upcoming appearance of Merlin the Magician, set for Monday, November 15th at the High School Auditorium, at the meeting Tuesday.

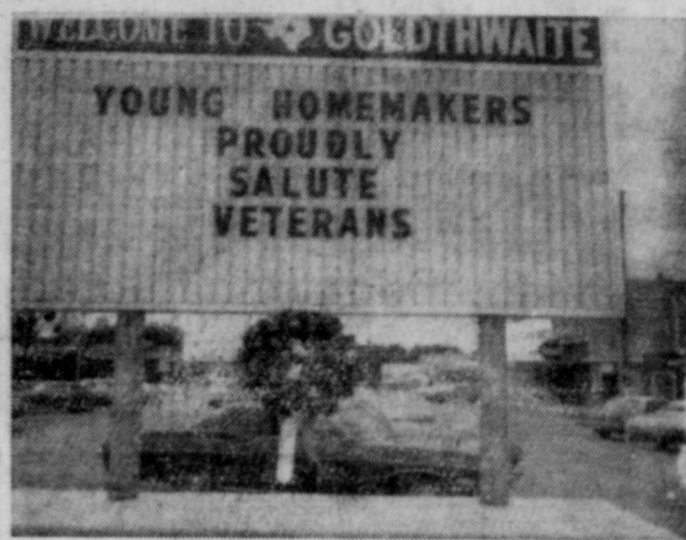
Horace Brooks reported the sound truck will be in operation to add to the publicity and Norman Duren was in charge of posters for the Lions sponsored mystery show.

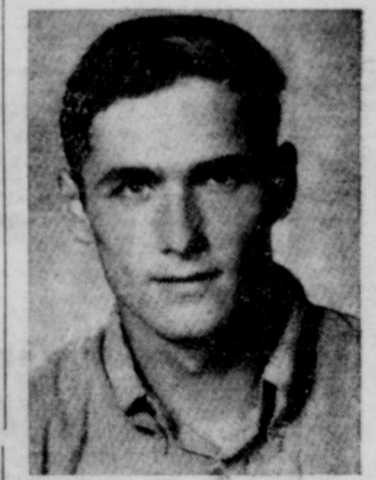

The Goldthwaite Eagle "B" team has won their last two games to move their season record to 6-1 with two games remaining.

The "B" team traveled to Bangs October 21 and defeated the Dragons 43-6.

Andy Cook got things started in the Bangs game by driving over from the 5 yard line on the Eagles first possession. Cook also added the extra point to make it 7-0.

Steve Gist scored next for the Eagles and Larry Elliot added the two points to bring the score to 15-0.

In the second quarter Bangs scored on a long pass for their only points in the game.

Elliot added six more points before the half to make the score at halftime 21-6.

In the second half Dale Page scored on a pass from QB Terry McLean and Elliot added the 2 points.

Gist added another six points and Cook also added the extra point.

In the final period Gist scored again which left the score 43-6 at the end of the game.

It was a fine defensive game especially for the secondary and McLean intercepted two passes. Cook, Chuck Shaw, and Lee Browning recovered two fumbles. It was a fine team effort by the Eagles "B" team.

GOLDTHWAITE VS EARLY

In last Thursday night's game the Eagle "B" team downed Early 25-14, but didn't look as impressive as they should.

The scoring went like this. On the Eagles first possession Andy Cook scored on a sweep behind the fine blocking of Dale Page, Ricky Stacy, and Tommy Standley. Cook also passed the extra point to make it 7-0.

Early then came back and went ahead 8-7, but Gist gave

the Eagles the lead again on the Eagles next possession by diving over from the 3 yard line. The try for the extra point failed.

Elliot managed to get the Eagles a 19-3 half time lead when he went over from six yards out late in the second quarter. This TD was set up on a fine 55 yard punt return by Andy Cook.

Early came to play, however, and scored on the first play from scrimmage in the second half which narrowed the score 19-14.

Elliot put the game on ice when he scored late in the game from 3 yards out, but the try for extra point failed. Score at the end of the game was 25 to 14.

It was not one of the "B" teams better games as they gave up the big play to Early on third and fourth and failed to come through on third or fourth downs when they controlled the ball.

The "B" team will travel to San Saba Thursday (tonight) to play the Dillo "B" team at 7:00.

Social Security Representative Will Be Here Nov. 11th

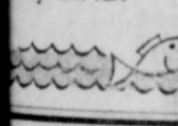

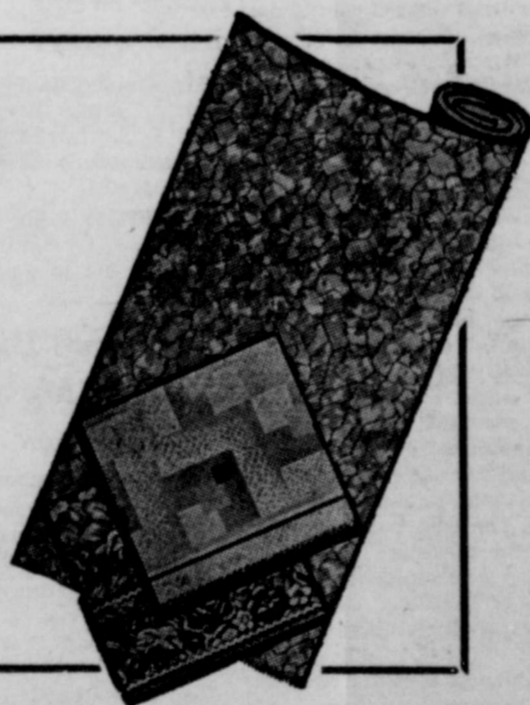

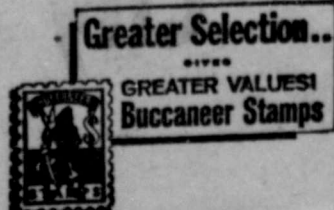

Creep feeding lambs is a practice that gets a lot of discussion both for and against. With the price of wool that it is, fat lambs are about the only profit potential there are in the sheep industry. Creeping helps to lighten the load on the ewes, thereby enabling them to maintain or improve their condition, and the lambs fatten more rapidly. Creep feeding is also useful when lambs are not fat enough to be sold off the ewes as fat lambs. Creep feeding usually means a difference of several cents a pound in favor of fat lambs over feeder lambs.

Producers have their own individual ideas of creep feeding rations and if they work, don't quit a winner.

However, a good all-purpose mixture for creep feeding is: 2 parts sorghum grain or cracked corn; 2 parts coarsely ground or crushed oats; and 1 part cottonseed meal.

Research indicates there is little or no advantage in favor of complex rations over simple rations for creep feeding. Pelleting does not increase the efficiency of grains sufficiently to offset the cost of pelleting.

Vitamin A should be included in the creep ration or administered as an injection. A daily intake of 1,000 international units per lamb is adequate. When injected into lambs, the dosage should be 250,000 units.

Aureomycin or terramycin at a level of 8 to 10 mg. per pound of ration should be added to help prevent infectious diseases and lowering the incidence of enterotoxemia.

The amount of feed depends on the size and age of the lamb. Lambs begin eating when they are a few days old. By the time they are 4 months old they may be eating as much as 3 pounds per head per day.

Peach Tree Borer: An insect which bore into the tree and feed on the cambium and inner bark at or below said level. These borers do extensive damage to fruit trees and cause the death to many trees. They can be controlled in several ways, one of which should be done now. This method is the application of Paradichlorobenzene crystals (moth balls) into the soil. Place these crystals in a narrow circular band in a grove about 2 inches from the trunk.

Place several shovels of clean soil over the crystals and mound the earth into a cone-shaped pile about 6 inches around the base of tree. Do not let crystals touch the tree. Remove mounds in spring. About one half ounce to one ounce of crystals is sufficient to trees.

This is also the time to apply an application of dormant aid to fruit trees to control scale, blister mite, red mite, and rose aphid.

Do not let your evergreen plants dry out during the winter months. Remember they require moisture all winter long. Once the grass has turned brown, we frequently forget to water our evergreen plants. It is especially important to provide adequate water just before the onslaught of a cold norther. Much of the cold injury to the plants could be avoided by supplying adequate moisture before the cold snap.

A protective collar of asphalt roofing paper placed around newly planted rose bushes will prevent desiccation of the canes by the drying winter winds. To make such a collar, use an eight inch wide strip of roofing paper about 36 inches in length to form a circle around the newly planted rose bush and tie it with wire. Fill the container thus formed with moist peat moss or moist pine bark. This serves as a mulch and prevents the canes from drying out. As soon as the canes begin to develop new growth, gradually remove the material inside by lifting the collar a few inches and pulling out the mulch.
