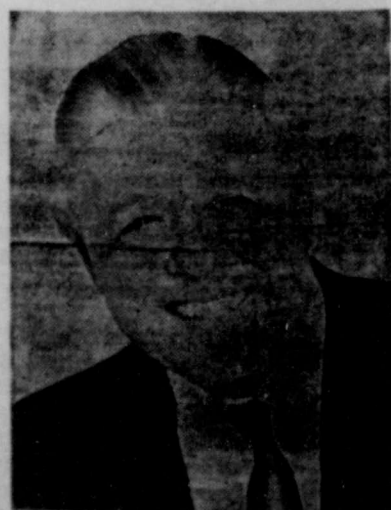

UNITY

The religious world of our day is divided. At the last count, there were over 300 different churches or groups claiming to be Christian. These churches wear different creeds and beliefs, and worship in different ways. The different groups are, for the most part, hostile to one another.

All thoughtful people are made to wonder if this division of Christianity is right. How can all this division, resentment, and even hatred be pleasing to Christ? Jesus once warned, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and no city or house divided against itself will stand." (Matthew 12:25). How can Christianity hope to accomplish the purposes of Christ, if it is divided against itself? This division is the work of Satan. Satan rejoices to see a divided Christianity. Division serves the cause of Satan, not the cause of Christ.

Many men in various denominations recognize the great error of a divided Christianity. William Barclay, well-known author and scholar, states: "It may well be that the greatest problem which the Church at present faces is the problem of her own disunity, and that disunity may well be not only the Church's greatest problem, but also the Churches greatest sin." Kagawa, the great Japanese Christian, was deeply distressed by this disunity. Once he said: "I do not speak English very well, and sometimes when I say the word denomination people think that I have said damnation—and to me they are the same thing."

One thing is certain from a careful reading of the New Testament, Jesus Christ wanted his followers to be united. He once prayed: I do not pray for these only, but also for those who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one; even as thou Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. The glory which thou has given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and thou in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that thou hast sent me and hast loved them even as thou hast loved me. (John 17: 20-23).

Jesus' earnest prayer was for the unity of his followers. Not

just those men who followed him in the First Century, but all who would come to believe on him. Jesus wanted his followers to be as united as He and God. This unity was to be a sign to the lost world. It was a sign that the disciples belonged to Christ, that Christ was sent by God, and that God loved them.

Who can deny that Jesus wanted his church to be united? Who will deny that Christianity today is divided? Jesus followers are just the opposite of what he desired for them. Who can believe that Jesus is pleased by all this disunity? But what can be done about the division? Can there ever be unity?

The answer to our question is, "Yes, there can be unity!" Jesus did not pray for an impossibility. But the way to unity is not easy. The way to unity is to go back to the Bible as our only guide in matters of religion. As long as man determines to add to God's word and to take away from it, there can be no hope for unity. Jesus said, "Sanctify them in the truth; thy word is truth." (John 17:17) The Apostle Paul cried, "But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we preached to you, let him be accursed." (Galatians 1:8).

Let there be a movement back to the Bible. Let there be more Bible reading, more Bible study, and more Bible discussion between the various factions of Christianity. Let each group agree to use Bible as their only standard or guide. Let each determine to throw out those practices and doctrines not found in God's word. Finally, let love prevail in matters of opinion, in matters not revealed in God's Word. Then, and only then, can there be a united Christianity. Then can the church be all that Jesus desired for her to be.

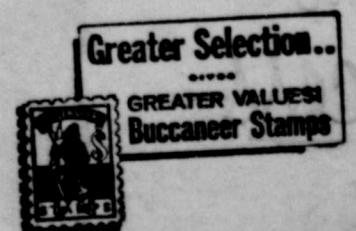

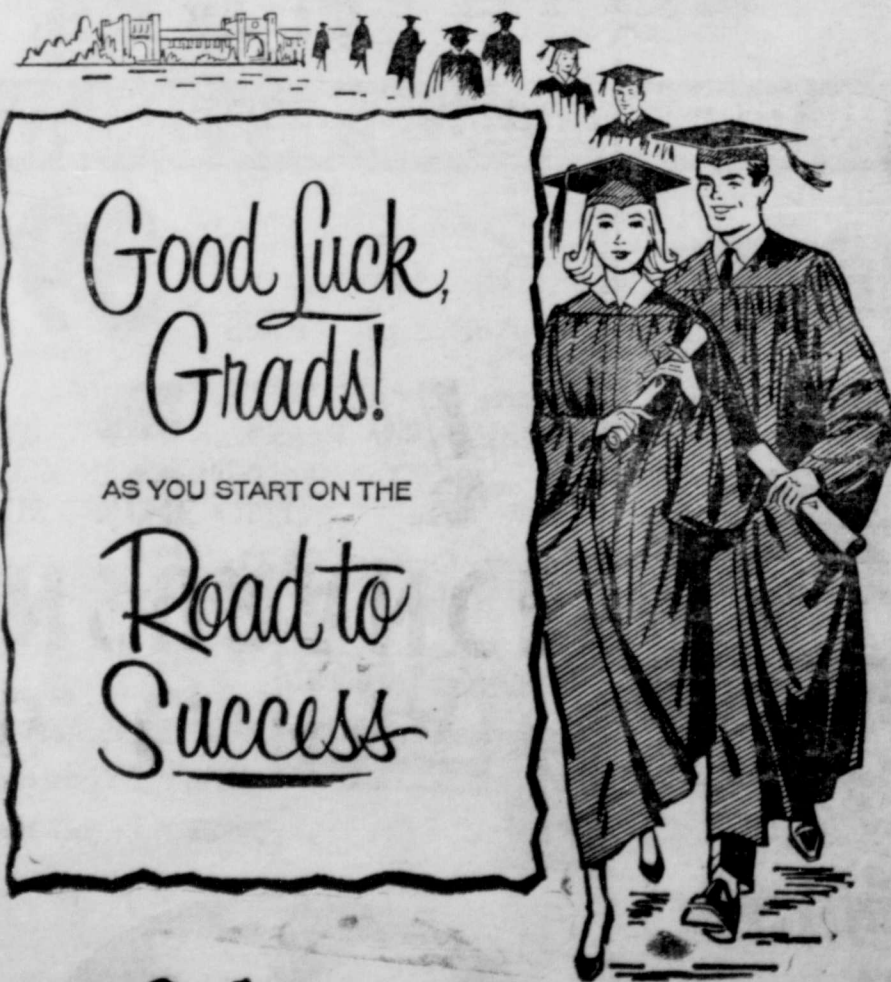

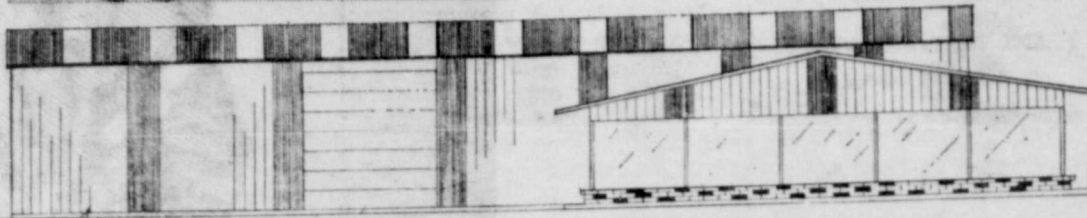
Saylor's Break Ground

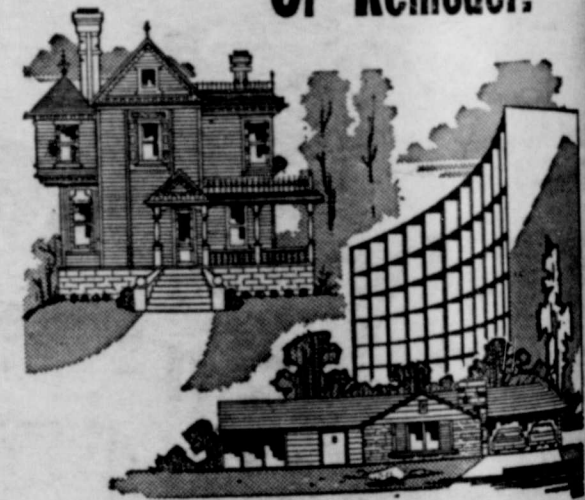
