Council Annexes Acreage; Approves RC&D Projects

The Goldthwaite City Council unanimously approved the annexation of 20.88 acres of land located at the North "Y" Tuesday night at its regular meeting.

The area, just south of the Santa Fe underpass on Highway 183 is owned by the Ivy family. No plans for the acreage was mentioned by the councilmen.

The council also sent a recommendation to the area Resource Conservation and Development Project for projects it feels is worthy of support.

The RC&D Project is a cooperative effort by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and local agencies. \$5,000,000 is expected to be used in a six county area of Mills, San Saba, Hamilton, Coryell, Bell and Milam.

The City asked for help in building the proposed sanitary land fill, work on a landing strip and for the summer recreational program here in Goldthwaite.

In other council business, water rights were given to Kellis Landrum and anyone else who wishes in the North Y area of Goldthwaite. The area, not in the city limits can be served by an old water line from a water well to the city mains. All expenses incurred in the hook-up to this line will be borne by the users and a rate of twice the regular

water cost will be charged to customers such as these, who use city water but have businesses or residences outside of the city limits.

These customers also will not have priority to the water and the city will not be responsible for water shortages to them. The council pointed out that its first responsibility was to the taxpayers of the city.

The operating report was read by City Manager Don Petty. He pointed out that the City received over \$5,000 for sales tax revenue for the first quarter of 1973. This figure represents about 30 per cent more than was expected to be derived from the 1 per cent tax.

Petty also gave the annual report on the property tax situation for the city. He stated that property was valued at \$1,189,552 and that the tax revenue realized from this would be \$17,843.

The Water District tax base is slightly higher, \$1,208,938, which brings \$18,134 into the district account. The water district is a little larger than the city limits.

All the councilmen were present at the meeting. They are Ancle Morgan, Donald Padgett, Hollis Wiggins, Jimmy Smith and Lester Geeslin. Mayor Ray Duren and City Secretary Glynn Collier were also present.

Mark Geeslin and Alfred Bunting were voting delegates for Goldthwaite and Area VII had about 125 voting delegates.

These delegates voted on such things as the State Program of Work, State Talent Team, State Sweetheart and the Election of the new State FFA President.

Mark Geeslin and Larry Elliott both received their Lone Star Farmer Degrees in ceremonies held Thursday night. This is the highest award the State gives to outstanding FFA members.

On Thursday morning, Alfred Bunting received the \$4000 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship for his outstanding FFA and academic achievements.

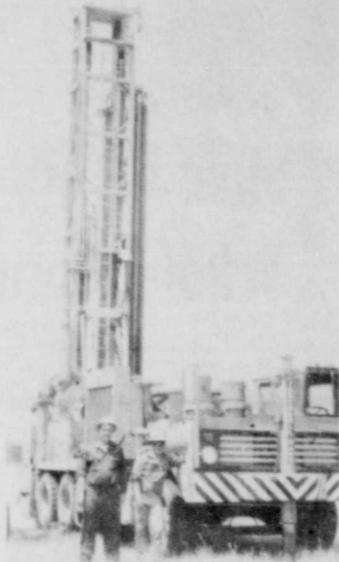
