## Gene Gray Killed Wednesday Morning U.S. 84 Crash Fatal

Horace Gene Gray, 27, of Goldthwaite was killed Wednesday morning at 4:45 a. m. when his car was rammed into the rear of a Mack diesel truck. The collision occurred 3.4 miles northwest of Goldthwaite on U. S. Highway 84.

Gray was returning from work at the S-M Corp. in Brownwood. Dallas DPS officer Ronnie Rush said the truck was traveling at a slow to middle rate of speed up a slight grade and Gray apparently went to sleep and rammed into the rear of the truck.

The '72 Monte Carlo was completely destroyed and the diesel truck sustained only minor rear end damage.

Rush and Mills County Sheriff Horace Brooks were called to the scene by the truck driver Jerry Lee Thorn, 27, of Seymour, Texas. Wilkins ambulance was then summoned and Gray was later pronounced dead on arrival at Childress Hospital.

Gray, a graduate of Goldthwaite High School, is survived by his parents Mr. and Mrs. Horace Gray; one son Chad; and two sisters Mrs. Philip Carr and Carrie Gray all of Goldthwaite.

Funeral services will be held at the First United Methodist Church at 2:00 p. m. Thursday, October 18.

## State Senator Jones Visits Goldthwaite Lions Club

Goldthwaite Lions Club heard Senator Grant Jones of Abilene at its regular meeting Tuesday night. The Senator made numerous references in the changes he has witnessed in state government in his nine (9) terms of office in the House of Representatives and the state senate.

He dwelled at length on the relationship between branches of government and how the systems work together and how pressures are applied from federal levels to state levels to produce legislation as state guidelines are set at the federal level.

For example, he mentioned the meat packers act which set up minimum standards for state regulations and if state government did not approve a meat packer inspection program then the whole industry would be absorbed by federal inspection.

Mr. Jones' district stretches from Abilene to Waco. This is

the first year that Senator Jones has been representing Mills County.

Lions Club zone chairman Ray Beggs of Buchanan Dam was also a guest at the meeting and reminds the club of its responsibility to the Lions Club Texas Camps and of other district, state and national Lions Club programs.

The club unanimously approved the turning over of the used clothing box on the Courthouse Square to be used by the Mills County 4-H Clubs for dispersal.

## Watershed Structures Full Following Great Rains

Mills County Soil Conservation Service specialist Charles Studer announced Tuesday that the various water shed project sites in Mills County received a tremendous amount of water during the past two weeks.

Blanket Creek, Site No. 17A, 18, 19, and 20, located on the Dick Jones, P. V. King, Ed Smith and Wallace Hickman ranches were all running through the principle spillways since last Saturday. The Brown-Mills Mullin Creek

area sites 5, 6, and 7 on the Weatherby and Geeslin ranches lack approximately two feet before running through their principle spillways or draw down tubes as of Tuesday.

Sites 2 and 3 on the M. E. Wylie and A. V. Wasserman ranches caught several feet of water during the heavy downpour of recent rain.

Sites 1 and 2 of the Bennett Creek Water Shed Project lack about 1.2 feet before entering the principle spillway.

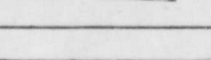

Born May 8, 1880, she was the daughter of the late Alexander McPherson and Catherine McPherson.

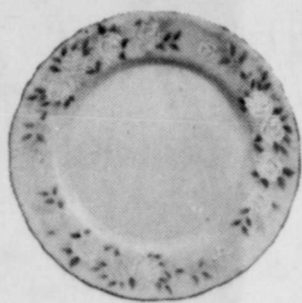

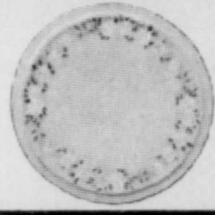

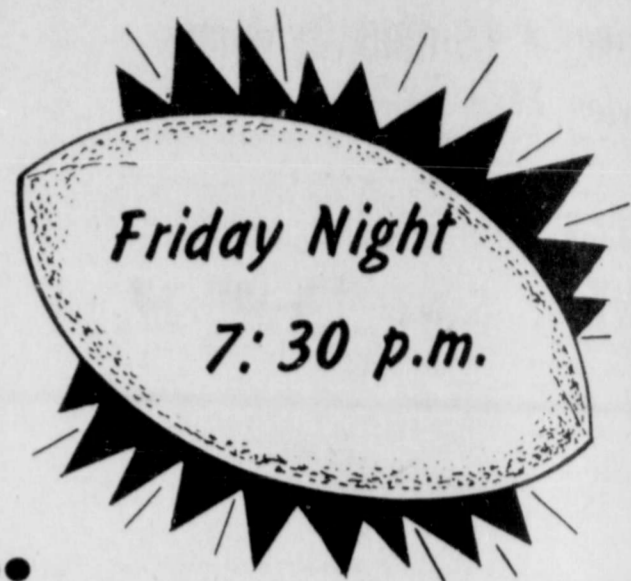
