Henderson, the Texas Highway Department has found that most litter is tossed by local people.

'Thoughtless citizens, not tourists or visitors from elsewhere, are mainly to blame for marring the beauty and cleanliness of our highways," Henderson said today. The task of picking up after

litterbugs falls to Highway Department maintenance crews. Maintenance foreman for State highways in Mills County is James A. Morgan. Morgan commented, "By tak-

ing men and equipment away from their job of keeping our highways in good repair, litter pickup costs the taxpayers of nearly \$3.3 million Texas a year.'

Henderson noted that the 9county Brownwood District, which includes Mills County, will spend about \$60,000 this year to pick up trash along highways and roadside parks.

"Litter costs in other ways, Henderson continued. "Sharp or broken objects tossed on the roadway can rip tires cause a driver to swerve unthinkingly out of his lane, per-

haps causing a tragic accident." Additionally, litter is unsani-tary. Rubbish along highways pro-vides a handy place for vermin to flourish, and pests thrive on carelessly discarded food scraps.

Henderson pointed out that no place on Texas highways is far from a litter receptacle. Litter barrels are installed in each roadside park and scenic turn-out maintained by the Texas Highway Department. And additional litter barrels have been placed at convenient special turnouts. "The final solution rests with each individual," Henderson con-

cluded. When all citizens realize that littering is not good citi-zenship - - and do something about it - - then roadside littering will cease to be a costly problem."
