Social Security News

WHEN TO CONTACT SOCIAL SECURITY

If you're nearing retirement age, you should contact a social security office about 2-3 months before you plan to retire.

Whether you're planning to retire or not, you should contact a social security office about 2-3 months before you reach 65 to make sure you will have full Medicare protection starting at 65. If you wait until your birthday month to apply, you will lose at least a month of Medicare medical insurance protection.

If you're just getting ready to enter the labor force, rather than leave it, you'll probably need a social security card. Nine out of 10 jobs are covered by social security. You should apply for your card at least 6 weeks before you need it.

While working, it's a good idea to check your social security record every 3 years or so to make certain your earnings are being correctly reported. You can get forms for this at your social security office. If the earnings statement on their record doesn't agree with your own record of earnings, the people in the social security office will assist you in getting it corrected.

Be sure to report any name change to social security.

To report a name change, fill out a Request for Change in Social Security Records, which is also available at any social security office. You'll need evidence showing both your old and new names.

If you're unable to work because of an illness or injury that is expected to last a year or longer, get in touch with a social security office right away. Both you and your family may be eligible for monthly benefits as long as you are disabled. And, after you've been eligible for disability payments for 2 consecutive years, you will have Medicare protection.

(A note about Medicare: While you work, you also earn credits toward Medicare hospital insurance protection for yourself and your dependents in the event they you or they ever need dialysis treatment or a kidney transplant for permanent kidney failure.)

When a worker dies, someone in the family should contact social security. Monthly survivors benefits may be payable even if the worker only had 1 1/2 years of work in the 3 years before he or she died.

An important point to remember about applying for social security benefits is that you should do so as soon as possible. A long delay in applying can cause loss of some benefits since back payments can be made for no more than 12 months.

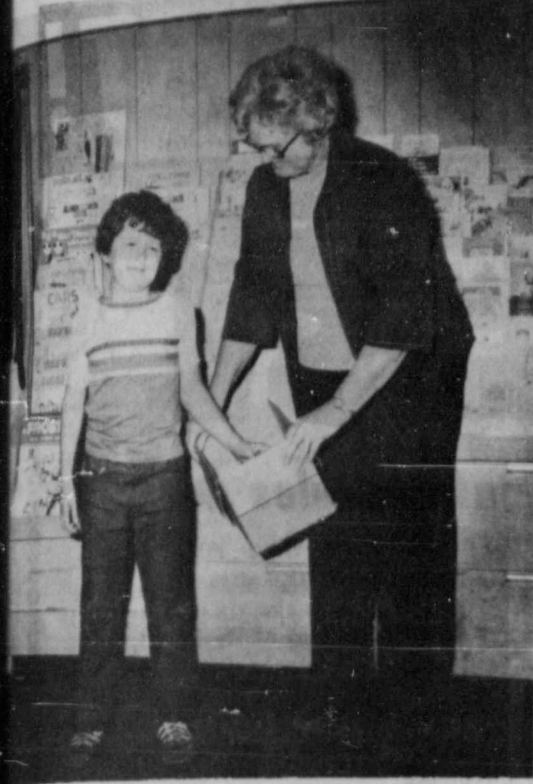

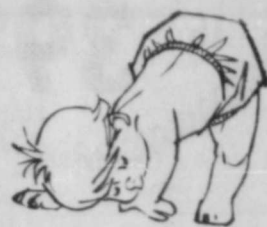
