Major Fire Destroys Downtown Structure

A fire of undetermined origin kept downtown Goldthwaite in a nervous condition Tuesday afternoon.

The fire was in the Geeslin Building, occupied by B & H Enterprise, a marble fabricating plant. It was first reported to fire department officials about 12:30 p.m.

Firemen fought the blaze all afternoon, with several men staving nearly all night watching the fire burn itself out. The construction of the building was such that the fire could not be extinguished. The roof had fallen in and semi-smothered the rafters, roofing material, and combustibles below, causing them to smolder. and keep the water from hoses from getting to the

A total of eight hoses were in operation at one time during the disaster, as fire department leaders utilized two fire plugs and four pumping trucks.

The marble works, owned by Zeke Becker of Goldthwaite, uses several kinds of resins and highly combustible mixtures in the preparation of its products. At many occasions during the course of the fight, explosions could be heard all over the downtown area as containers blew because of the intense heat.

Two persons were slightly injured in the fire. Johnny

Blansitt of Goldthwaite sustained a minor head laceration when a pry bar broke and hit him. He was treated at Childress Clinic and later returned to help further in the effort.

Another man was cut by glass from the front display windows of the building following an explosion that blew the glass out. His identity is not known, however, his injuries were of the City of Goldthwaite, described as very minor.

On numerous occasions throughout the afternoon. firemen were slightly overcome by the noxious fumes of the fire, and exchanged duties on the hoses frequently to avoid serious

R & W Floor Covering. located on the corner, and Steen Hardware, located just North of the fire site. sustained minor smoke damage and some water damage, according to fire department officers. Most of the perishable merchandise was taken out of R & W soon after the fire was

discovered R & W previously occupied a building four doors down the block, and were burned out at that location on June 14 of this year. They suffered complete loss of merchandise in that fire. The Geeslin Building fire

was also listed as a total

loss.

Predator Control Assn. **Quickly Rejuvenated Here**

Members of the Mills County Predator Control Association met October 29, 1979 to discuss problems of funding the program, which the association has encountered the last few months. Because of the lack of interest of people who once participated in the program and more numerous bounties paid during 1979, the predator control program has been running short of funds at the close of each month. Prior to the meeting, the Predator fund showed a balance of \$31.49.

Mills County receives equipment, a trapper, fuel and a pickup for \$425.00 per month. Mr. Bud Moon, Animal Damage Control Specialist, met with the association and explained that Mills County is the only county in Central Texas that is receiving a vehicle at no additional cost. Our pickup is old and in bad need of major repairs. This pickup will have to be sold at public auction in San Antonio soon by the A.D.C.

The Animal Damage Control association will furnish forms in the near future for ranchers to sign which will permit helicopter hunting late this year. Everyone is urged to sign up for helicopter hunting. If an animal runs from a pasture that is signed up to a pasture that is not, the animal cannot be killed. Forms for helicopter hunting will be available from Norman Duren at the post office, at Mills County State Bank, and the office of the County Judge. Also, the A.D.C.A. will furnish twenty cents per mile if our trapper furnishes his own pickup.
