The modern sewage-disposal plant consists, essentially, of a heap of rocks covered with a film of these bacteria. The sewage flows on to it a stream of unimaginable impurity. The bacteria seize upon the filth and cleanse the liquid, and from beneath the heap flows pure water laden with harmless



J. B. Case of Abilene, Kan., called the convention to order. He introduced Frew W. Fleming, the chairman of the executive committee. Then Mayor H. M. Beardsley for the city delivered an address of welcome to the delegates. Gov. Joseph W. Folk, Senator William Warner and Senator W. J. Stone, representing Missourl, and Gov. E. W. Hoch, representing Kansas also made wercoming addresses. Short addresses were made by Gov. Frantz of Oklahoma and Gov. John H. Mickey of Nebraska.

Responses to the addresses of welcome were made by various senators. congressmen and delegates from other states and territories. The morning session closed with an address by David R. Francis of St. Louis, the president of the congress.

Rivers have changed their courses and have adopted the railroad cuts on both sides of the Cascades for channels, probably permanently.

A New Canal Zone Order.

Washington, . D. C. - An order signed on the Isthmus of Panama by President Roosevelt making radical changes in the organization of affairs in government for the canal zone was made public monday at the offices of the commission. The effect of the order is to place the canal work and the government of the zone under the direction of Chairman Shonts, aided by chiefs of bureaus who will report directly to the commission, thus eliminating the office of governor.

American Sugar Company Guilty. New York. -- The American Sugar Refining company was found guilty by a jury in the United States circuit court Tuesday of accepting rebates amounting to \$26,000 from the New York Central railroad. The New ork Central was recently found guilty of giving rebates to the American Sugar Refining company and fined \$108,000

Want New Treaty with Japan. San Jose, Calif. - In an inter-Congressman E. A. Hays said: "I expect to introduce a resolution at the coming session of con gress asking the president to enter into negotiations with Japan for the purpose of making a new treaty between the two countries to settle this question of Japanese immigration in cmewhat the same manner as we settled the question with China, which I believe to be the only sure way of preventing serious trouble and perhaps war with Japan.


