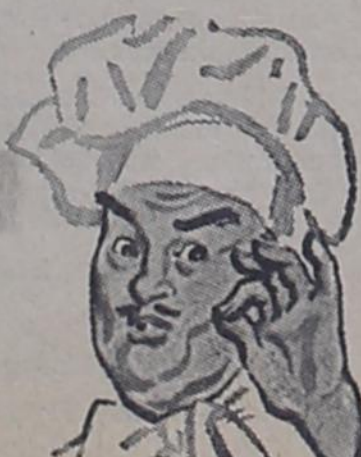

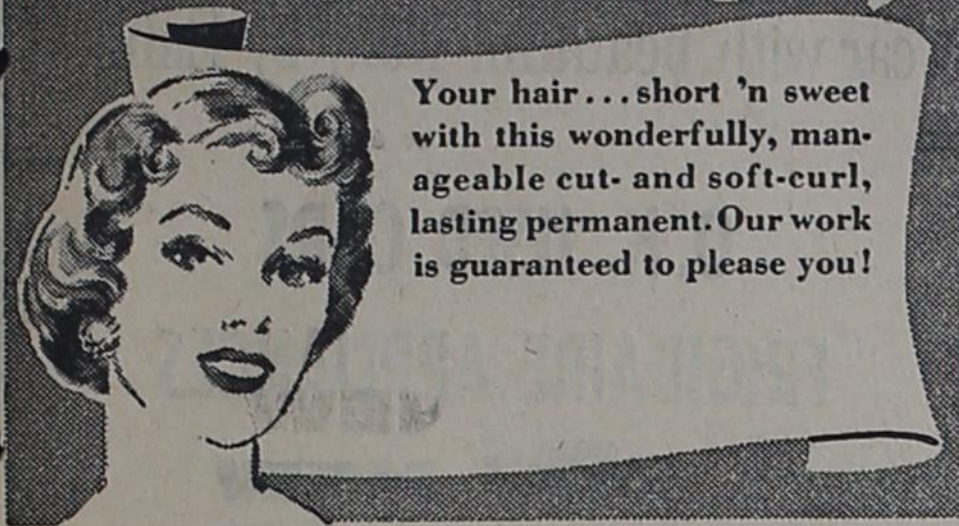

Because there still are some irrigation well operators in Parmer County who are operating their wells in such a manner as to cause hazardous road conditions, water in bar ditches, interference with school buses, mail routes, and farming operations of others, the Parmer County Water Board feels it is necessary to call attention to the laws under which our Water District operates.

It is the viewpoint of the committee that our water problems can be worked out democratically and through education, for the reason that we all have mutual interests in this matter. However, it is the duty of the Board to call to your attention the laws of the district which provide court action for the elimination of the conditions mentioned.

We will appreciate your attention to this matter, and trust that we can control this situation on a voluntary basis. Still, the interests of all the users of the District must be protected. It is suggested that you exercise care to see that your irrigation water is not wasted.

ful. He and the others pointed out that when borders are built up at the ends of the fields, and the water is forced to stay, it "backs up" seldom more than 20 or 30 feet, and then is in danger of drowning out the crop if allowed to stand for too long a time.  
 McClaren brought up another point: "We know we are wasting water when we run it into the bar ditch—and we don't want to waste water—but we think that we waste more water when we don't produce."  
 He was speaking of insufficient irrigation of certain parts of the crop, which although they received some water, were practically not worth harvesting. The water put on this poor part of the crop has been wasted, believes McClaren.  
 Readhamer, who came from Hale County where there are no pumping regulations (Hale and Swisher Counties are not in the district), said, "I never heard of a Water Board until I came to Parmer County."  
 "They have taken the attitude that keeping the water out of the ditches is their business, and that what to do with it in the field is my problem."  
 "I would appreciate some suggestions on how to solve these water conservation problems. I think that some program such as what now exists with the Soil Conservation Service ought to be worked out."
