Taking pencil and paper he called for her other expenses; railroad fare for herself, one child an nurse $\$ 17$, hotel bill $\$ 12$, carriage and car fare $\$ 2.50$, other expenses $\$ 5$-a total incidental expense of $\$ 36.50$, making the suit cost, in fact, $\$ 71.50$.

Her astonishment at the actual cost of the suit was only equalled by her chagrin, but a moment later, with a shrug of the shoulders, she asked "What else is a body to do ?"

Commenting on the incident the gentleman said to me: "I do not see why some one of our local merchants doesn't stock these 'standard' things that women are going to have and stop their going to the city for them; they not only lose that particular class of trade, but these city shoppers always buy a lot of other stuff that could be bought at home. In many of the smaller towns that I visit I see in the show windows the same brands of well-known goods that I see in the city windows, and as well displayed, and these enterprising merchants tell me that they are lessening considerably the city shopping of their citizens.'

Insofar as he carries a complete stock of up-to-date, well-known "trade-marked-advertised" goods, and advertises and displays them well, just so far will the small-town merchant turn the steady flow of his town's money from the city into his own tills.

People should and will buy what they want at home if they can get it at home.
