Energy saving tipsjustin time for summer's heat

Everyone would like to save money
on energy bills, but in the scorching heat of a Texas summer, staying cool is maintenance to air conditioning and still save money. The following tips form the Texas Energy Extension Service will help prepare air Agood way to tart is to insulate the
air-conditioning ducts. Before beginning, tape any cracks. Ber gaps and
all the joints in the tape. Then, wrap the ducts with two to-four-inch thick R11 insulation and secure with lape. Besure hei insulation has a vapor barrier. This prevents
vapor from condensing on the cold Have the air conditioning unit service person before the warmest weather arrives. A thorough inspection include: oiling the condensional should motor, cleaning the condensing coil condensing uniter fan, checking the inspecting the compressor run capacitors for leaks, cleaning the supply-air fan motor housing and oiling switch. The cost of an annual
The cosking maintenance check is usually betwee
$\$ 25$ and $\$ 50$. The air filter should also be changed
seasonally and then once a month during the summer. protect the outside portion of the air conditioning unit from the sun's rays.
Shrubs or lattice work can effectively shade the unit and help to lower cooling costs.
