Weekly Swing of SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

PRODUCTION AND MARKETING ADMINISTRATION, U. S. D. A.

Stronger livestock prices featured last week's trading at southwest markets the USDA's Production and Marketing Administration reports.

Cattle generally found good demand, at steady to stronger prices, in southwest trading last week. But mixed trends prevailed at midwest markets where slaughter steers and heifers nosed 5¢ to \$1. Meanwhile, beef cows showed stronger prices around the market circle. Monday's early livestock reports showed no important changes in trends.

Hogs showed fairly consistent 20¢ to 50¢ price gains at all southwest and midwest markets last week over the previous week's close. Monday's top butcher prices were \$18 at Fort Worth, \$17.50 at San Antonio, Oklahoma City and Kansas City.

Egg prices, in slow to good demand, were about steady last week at most southwest farm markets. Production continued high. Liberal receipts were the rule. Fryers, however, gained 1¢ to 2¢ a pound over the previous week in a comeback after recent price breaks.

Cotton advanced 75¢ at Dallas, 20¢ each at Houston and Galveston, remained steady at other markets in Monday to Monday trading.

There were no witnesses to the accident, but it was believed that his glove was caught in the saw of the stand and he was pulled into the machinery. He was found dead by J. D. Morris and Z. J. Neeley after the gin stopped.

The young man was born Sept. 5, 1932. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. James M. Kennedy of McKnight. He is also survived by his wife and a son, Robert Lynn.

Other survivors include two brothers and a sister, Cecil Loyce, Marvin Carol and Cieta Fay Kennedy, all of McKnight, and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Liveness and J. H. Kennedy of Lakeview.

While in Shamrock, Mr. Perin will work with the Training men of the Southern District, and with the Commissioners as well as Troop and Explorer Leaders.

The "Trunk Load of Adventure" that Bob packs around the country with him is a result of years of outdoor experience and adventure in his own life. His early life was spent on a ranch high in the mountains of Utah near Bryce Canyon. During his high school days, he worked as a wrangler at the Grand Canyon and Zion National Parks, guiding Dudes and visitors through the many trails of these great natural wonderlands.

After leaving the University of New Mexico, Mr. Perin went to live with the Mescalero Apache Indians during which time he had opportunity to learn the ways of the Indian in hunting and woodcraft. This interest in the Indian people later led him to do some work with the University of New Mexico at the Indian ruins at Chaco Canyon and Jemez Springs where the University has two Archeological Schools. The next few years found him in Arizona where he hunted the Lost Dutchman's Gold Mine in the Superstition Mountains, and deer, bear and mountain lions under the Tonto Rim of Zane Grey fame.

TONGUE AND PEAS Scalloped

Preparation: Fresh Tongue. Cover with cold water; add 1 1/2 teaspoons salt to each quart of water; bring to a boil. Simmer slowly until tender. Allow 1 to 1 1/2 hours. Keep tongue in the liquid until cool enough to handle, then remove outer skin.

2 cups cooked tongue
1 cup cooked peas
2 cups medium white sauce
Grated cheese

Slice tongue, then cut into small pieces. Combine with cooked peas and white sauce. Place in buttered casserole. Top with grated cheese. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) about 30 minutes.

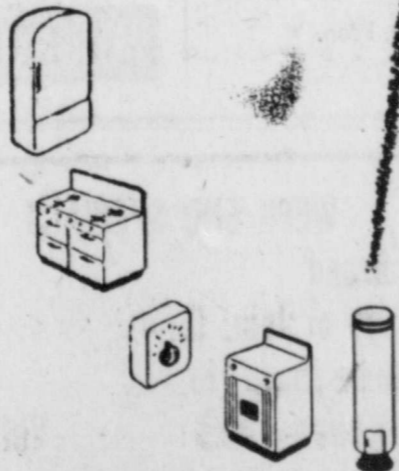
