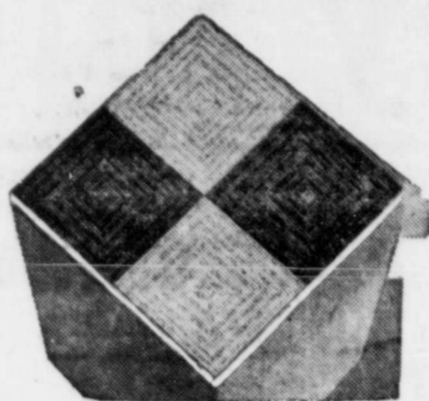

Central Standard Time of July 3, 1951, for constructing the following improvements for the City of Hedley, Texas (a large percent of the materials are to be furnished by the City of Hedley, Texas, and are now on hand): Sewage Disposal Plant consisting of Imhoff tank, sludge beds, and screening chamber; 25,800 ft. of 8" 6" and 4" vitrified tile sewer lines with a maximum depth of 12 ft. and accessory construction; at which time and place the proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud. Any bid received after closing time will be returned unopened.

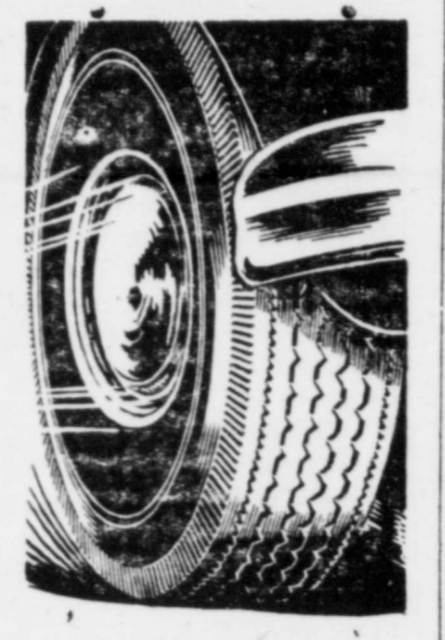
