## Amendments

Following is an outline of the nine amendments to be voted on next Tuesday, Nov 4:

Number One on the ballot (HJR 1)—Provides for annual sessions of the legislature, changing the compensation, per diem and travel expenses of members of the legislature and authorizing temporary residence of the Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House in the Capitol Building.

Number Two on the ballot (SJR 6)—Authorizes each county to establish, after approval by its voters, a retirement, disability and death compensation fund covering the elective officers of the county or precinct, as well as the appointive officers and employes of the county or precinct.

Number Three on the ballot (HJR 30)—Provides that vacancies in the office of County Judge and Justices of the Peace shall be filled by the Commissioners Court only until the next General Election.

Number Four on the ballot (HJR 31)—Provides that any District, County, or Precinct official serving a four-year term must resign before announcing for a different office if there remains unserved more than one (1) year of the term for which he was elected.

Number Five on the ballot (HJR 48)—Provides that a Home Rule City may provide by Charter Provision, and a City operating under the general laws may provide by majority vote, for a longer term of office than two (2) years for its officers, either elective or appointive, or both not to exceed four years.

Number Six on the ballot (HJR 17)—Provides for pension to retired Texas Rangers who are ineligible to participate in the Employees Retirement System of Texas, and their widows.

Number Seven on the ballot (SJR 4)—Authorizes the Legislature to make appropriations and establish procedure for advertising the historical, natural, agricultural, industrial, educational, recreational and other resources of Texas

Number Eight on the ballot (HJR 36)—Gives the Legislature the power to authorize vendor payments for medical care in addition to the amount paid in the form of direct public assistance to and on behalf of needy recipients of Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Blind,

She is survived by her husband, A. A. Cooper of Amarillo, and three sisters, Mrs. Kittie Landers of DeKalb, Mrs. J. F. Thornton of Henrietta and Mrs. L. R. Smith of Dumas.

## Basketball News

Local fans enjoyed two exciting basketball games last Friday night in the local gym. Both the Hedley boys and girls played McAdoo, a power in Class B.

The Hedley girls played an outstanding game, defeating the McAdoo girls 51 to 39. High point girl for Hedley was Betty Sanders with 21. Tobytha Sanders was close behind with 20 points, Alexander made 6 and McPherson 4.

The Hedley boys played an excellent game, but wound up on the short end of the score, 43 to 50. Cox was high for Hedley with 17, Maddox made 10, Wiggins 7 and Hargrove 7. This was a rather rough game, with several substitutions necessary in the last quarter. The Hedley boys showed much promise in this game, and will, we feel sure, give most of the area teams a rough time this year.

Number Nine on the ballot (SJR 3)—Authorizes the Legislature to create a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits to the City of Amarillo, Texas and a county wide Hospital District in Wichita County, Texas, and Hospital Districts in Jefferson County, Texas.

## Greenbelt Dam News

A committee from the Greenbelt Water Authority conferred with government officials at Amarillo last Thursday. Present at the interview were R. W. Jennings, director of Region 5, U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, D. R. Burnett and Tom Cantine also of the Bureau and Congressman Walter Rogers. Attending from the Water Authority were President S. H. Townsend of Childress, Secretary-Treasurer C. L. Johnson, Directors George Shadid of Wellington, T. H. Harrison of Memphis, Carroll Knorpp of Clarendon, Bill Thompson, Secretary of the Childress Chamber of Commerce and Mike McCully of Clarendon.

The definite amount of aid from the reclamation board can not be determined until the mapping, coring of the river at the dam site and cost of the dam is obtained, but the committee was assured of some Federal Aid. Congressman Walter Rogers promised his full support of our project.

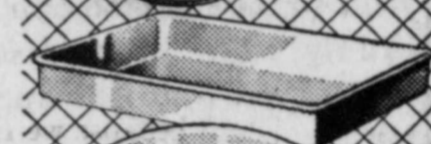

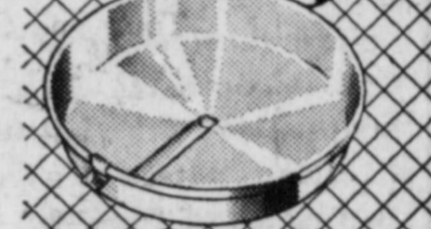
