## Greenbelt Dam News

Representatives of a coring firm were in town Friday visiting the site of the Greenbelt Dam north of Hedley. They were making a survey before bidding on the initial coring contract which includes five holes at the Greenbelt site, two in the river bed and three on the banks of the river, four holes at the Samnorwood site and three holes at the O M site which is about three miles west of the Oklahoma State line.

Other prospective sites for future dams may be cored later. Two other core contracting firms have already viewed the sites and the opening of the bids is expected in the next few days.

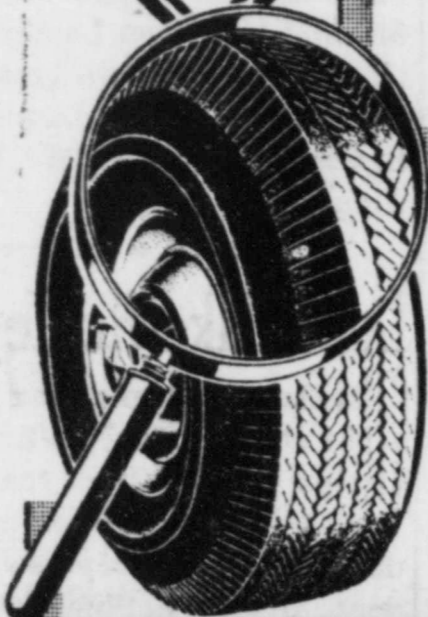

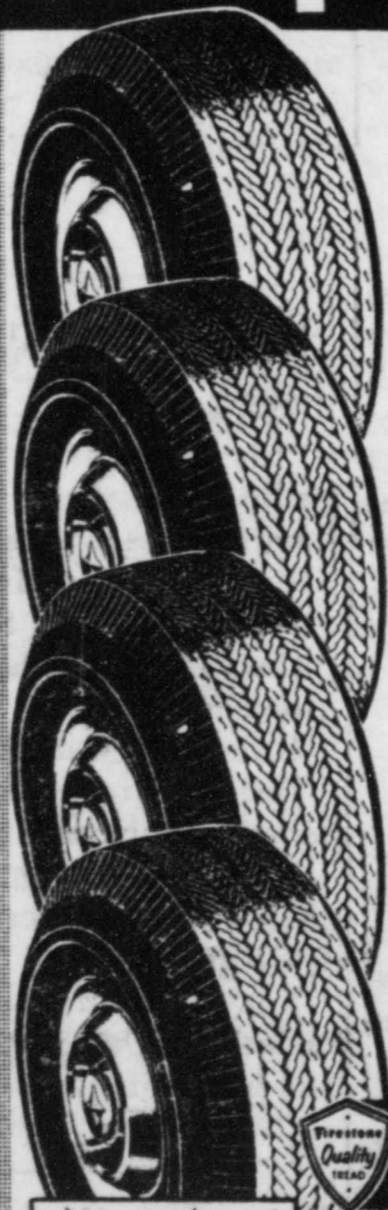
