April 15 is the deadline for having your 1964 inspection sticker on your vehicle. Only half of the vehicles in Region 5 of the Texas Dept. of Public Safety have their 1964 stickers, according to Capt. Alan Johnson, Motor Vehicle Inspection Service of the D. P. S.

"Residents of Donley County own 3,012 registered vehicles and 1,600 have not been inspected as yet," Johnson said.

"Under the law there can be no extension of the deadline, and motorists who fail to display the new sticker on and after April 16 are subject to arrest," he said.

Notice of Election

The State of Texas
County of Donley

To the Resident, Qualified, Electors of Said County, Who Own Taxable Property in Said County and Who Have Duly Rendered the Same for Taxation:

Take Notice that an election will be held in said County at the time and places, and on the Proposition as provided in the Order Calling An Election, duly passed by the Commissioners' Court of said County, which Order is substantially as follows:

AN ORDER CALLING AN ELECTION

The State of Texas
County of Donley

Whereas, there has been presented for the consideration of the Court a Petition signed by B M Hicks and 130 other persons praying that an election be held in Donley County, Texas, on the proposition of the issuance of \$100,000 of Road Bonds of said County, and the levy of a tax in payment thereof; and

Whereas, the Court has found that said Petition is signed by more than fifty (50) of the resident, qualified property taxpaying electors of Donley County owning taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation; and

Whereas, the amount of bonds to be issued will not exceed one-fourth of the assessed valuation of the real property of said Donley County;

It is Therefore Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed by the Commissioners Court of Donley County, Texas:

1. That an election be held in said County on the 11th day of April, 1964, which is not less than thirty (30) days from the date of this order, to determine:

"Whether or not the bonds of Donley County, Texas, shall be issued under Article III, Section 52 of the Constitution in the amount of \$100,000, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed Four (4%) per cent per annum, and maturing at such time as may be fixed by the Commissioners' Court, serially or otherwise, in not to exceed Twenty (20) years from the date thereof, for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized or paved roads or in aid thereof throughout Donley County, Texas; and whether or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied annually on all taxable property in said County sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay

the bonds at their maturity."

The proceeds from the sale of said bonds are to be expended primarily for the purchase of right-of-way from the easterly city limits of Clarendon Texas to the Donley-Hall County Line along U. S. Highway 287.

2. That said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter 3, Title 22, Revised Statutes of 1925, as amended by Chapter 16, Acts of the First Called Session of the 39th Legislature.

3. All persons who are legally qualified electors of this State and of this County, and who are resident, qualified property taxpaying electors of this County, owning taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all electors shall vote in the election precinct of their residence

4. The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For the Issuance of Road Bonds and the Levying of an Ad Valorem Tax in Payment Thereof"

"Against the Issuance of Road Bonds and the Levying of an Ad Valorem Tax in Payment Thereof"

5. The said election shall be held at the several polling places in Donley County, Texas, as follows:

In Voting Precinct No. 1 at Community Center, Goldston;

In Voting Precinct No. 2 at the Courthouse, Clarendon;

In Voting Precinct No. 3 at Community Center, Lelia Lake;

In Voting Precinct No. 4 at the City Hall, Clarendon;

In Voting Precinct No. 5 at the City Hall, Hedley;

In Voting Precinct No. 6 at Community Center, Ashtola;

In Voting Precinct No. 7 at Elevator Office, Jesicho;

In Voting Precinct No. 8 at Frank Crisp Residence, Greenwood-Whitefish;

In Voting Precinct No. 9 at Elmo Nall Residence, Skillett;

In Voting Precinct No. 10 at Baptist Church Building, Martin;

In Voting Precinct No. 11 at Leroy McCracken Residence, Midway.

6. The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the General Laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove cited.

7. Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in "The Donley County Leader", and "The Hedley Informer", newspapers published in said County, for three

(3) successive weeks before the date fixed for holding said election. In addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at four public places in the County one of which shall be at the Courthouse door for three (3) weeks prior to said election.

8. The County Clerk is hereby directed to have published and to post the same as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officers and received by the Court.

Cotton Release

As we have told you before, we had 757.1 acres of cotton released in our county to be reapportioned to other producers who requested more cotton.

On Wednesday, March 11, a total of 670.3 acres of cotton was given our county making the acreage to be reapportioned 1427.4. This is not as much as we had last year but we are always pleased with any amount we are able to get.

Revised notices of allotments will be mailed very soon to all farmers who requested additional cotton.

Feed Grain Program

Let us remind producers with barley, grain sorghum, and corn bases that March 27, 1964, is the final date to sign up in the program.

Several producers have inquired about the possibility of planting castor beans on diverted acres. Castor beans can be planted and harvested on diverted acres with a reduction in the diverted acres payment. You must state your plans on the "Intention to Participate" as to whether or not you will plant any of the approved substitute crops.

If you are thinking of planting castor beans or any of the approved substitute crops, please do not fail to come in before March 27 and talk with us about it.

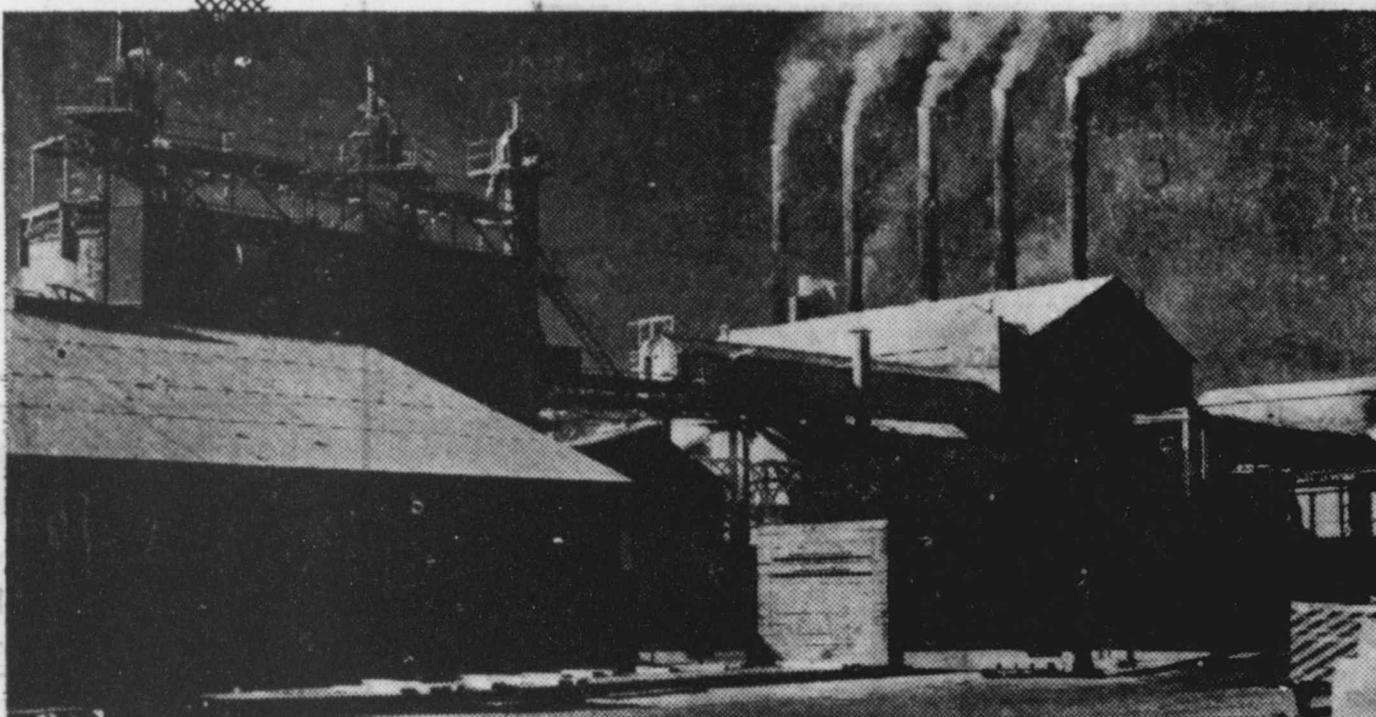

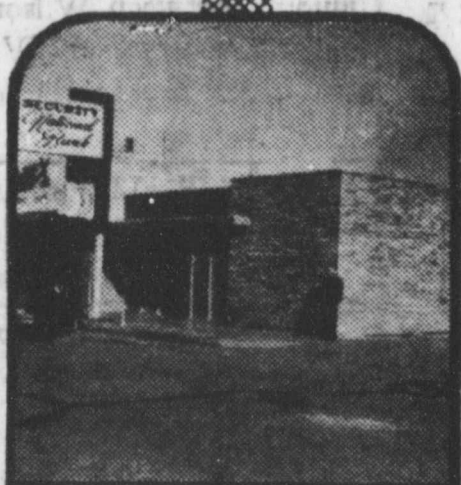

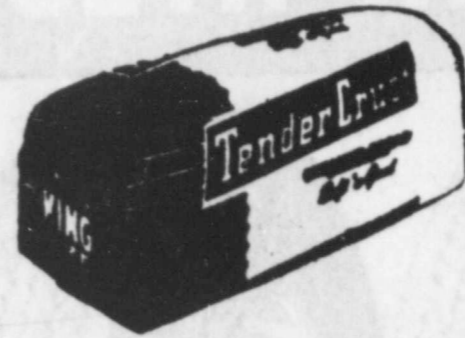
